## TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA THE UNITED STATES AND OTHER COUNTRIES

**MAY** 1971

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#### REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

During the first five months of 1971 cumulative statistics show that 10 million United States residents visited Canada, a slight increase from last year. Canadian residents returning from visits to the United States numbered 12 million, a decline of 4.1 per cent from January - May 1970. This aggregate decline of 504,900 Canadian re-entries from the United States results primarily from a decrease in same day automobile traffic, and is generally attributed to the adverse weather conditions which prevailed during the first quarter and into the second quarter. Statistics show that this decrease in Canadian same day automobile traffic was widespread across Canada.

Cumulative totals show that 126,300 overseas visitors entered Canada, a 4.7 per cent decrease from January — May 1970. January — May 1971 aggregative totals show that Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries numbered 359,600, a 7.8 per cent increase from last year.

#### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

During May 1971, 3,098,000 United States residents entered Canada. This total represents an increase of 3.4 per cent over May of last year. Canadians returning from the United States for the same time interval numbered 3,014,000, a 3.9 per cent decrease.

The most pronounced changes in United States visitors to Canada, occurred in the non-automobile category. In May 1971, United States visitors by bus numbered 131,300, a 24.5 per cent increase from May 1970. Rail traffic recorded a decrease of 7,300 (63.6 per cent) entries.

Canadian rail and bus traffic to the United States followed a similar pattern. Bus traffic recorded an increase of 15.8 per cent, whereas rail traffic recorded a decrease of 6,400 (90.5 per cent) re-entries.

This apparent turnabout in the mode of transportation resulted from two factors. First, an administration change in the method of data collection occurred May 1, 1971. Passengers by train would be transported across the frontier by bus and then once again proceed by train. Previously this transition was recorded by customs officials as "train", while under the new system this pattern of traffic is being recorded as "bus" traffic. Secondly, a portion of the decrease in rail traffic is attributable to the lack of demand for rail services as is evident by the closing of train service through the ports of; Lacolle Que., Sarnia Ont., Emerson Man., and White Rock B.C.

#### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Overseas Visitors entering Canada during May 1971 numbered 49,000, a slight decrease from last year. Province of entry data shows that of this total 40,000 (81.8 per cent) entered in either Ontario or Quebec. Visitors from the United Kingdom accounted for 28.9 per cent of the aggregate total.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries numbered 63,300, a 10.0 per cent increase from last year. As expected most Canadians from visits overseas re-entered through the province of Ontario (39.9 per cent) and Quebec (38.0 per cent).
