

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REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

Preliminary estimates of travel expenditures for the first six months of 1971 indicate that Canada's deficit position on travel account with all countries remained relatively unchanged when compared to the first six months of last year. Foreign visitors spent an estimated \$413 million in Canada for the first half year as compared to \$406 million the previous year. The total expenditures by foreign visitors to Canada for the first six months this year comprise of \$357 million spent by residents of the United States and \$56 million by visitors from overseas countries. This total for the first half of 1971 represents a 1.7 per cent increase over the comparable period last year. Canadian payments abroad were estimated at \$692 million and were comprised of \$459 million in the United States and \$233 million in overseas countries, a slight change from a year earlier. On an overall basis the above expenditure data shows a net deficit of \$279 million for the first six months of this year as compared to \$291 million for the first half of 1970, and represents a slight improvement in the travel account portion of the balance of payments.

Canadian payments to the United States for the first six months of this year decreased \$10 million from last year, whereas revenues derived from United States expenditures in Canada increased \$13 million, thus narrowing the deficit on travel account with the United States to \$102 million from \$125 million a year earlier. Payments by Canadians overseas increased \$5 million from a year earlier, whereas receipts derived from overseas visitors spending in Canada decreased \$6 million, thus further widening Canada's total deficit on travel by \$11 million to \$177 million.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

Cumulative statistics for the first six months of 1971 show that 14,153,500 United States visitors entered Canada, a slight decrease from last year. During the same time interval Canadians visiting the United States numbered 14,916,000, a 4.7 per cent decrease from a year earlier.

In June 1971, United States residents visiting Canada numbered 4,069,100, representing a 1.5 per cent decline when compared with June of last year, while Canadian residents returning from visits to the United States during June of this year totalled 3.184.500, a 6.8 per cent decrease.

The most pronounced change in United States visitors, occurred in the non-automobile caterogy. In June 1971, visitors by rail numbered 5,800, down 65.7 per cent from June last year. Canadian rail traffic followed a similar pattern as a decrease of 5,800 (87.8 per cent) re-entries was recorded. This decrease in rail is primarily attributable to a deceleration in the demand for rail service as is evident by the ceasing of train service through various ports across Canada.

In June 1971 United States visitors to Canada by automobile numbered 3,405,000, a 1.7 per cent decrease from last year, which was approximately evenly distributed between short-term and long-term automobile traffic. Bus and boat traffic during the month of June recorded increases of 7.1 per cent and 14.7 per cent respectively.

During the month of June 1971, 2,761,800 Canadians returning from the United States re-entered by automobile, an 8.7 per cent decrease from June last year. The majority of this decrease was the result of a decline in same day traffic which recorded 222,400 (9.6 per cent) fewer re-entries, and accounted for 87.3 per cent of the aggregate automobile decrease for June of this year.

Province of re-entry data shows that the decrease in Canadian same day automobile re-entries was most pronounced in Quebec and British Columbia where decreases of 17.3 and 24.9 per cent were recorded from June of last year.

A portion of the decrease in short-term Canadian automobile traffic in British Columbia may be attributed to festivities surrounding that province's centennial this year.

In the Canadian non-automobile category bus traffic increased by 9,300 re-entries, 9.8 per cent over June of last year, whereas re-entries by plane and boat showed no significant change.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Overseas visitors entering Canada during the first six months of 1971 numbered 198,300, a slight decrease from the first six months a year earlier. Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries numbered 438,400 re-entries, an increase of 4 per cent as compared to the first six months last year.

Statistics for the month of June indicate that 72,000 overseas visitors entered Canada. Visitors from Europe accounted for 72.2 per cent of this aggregate total which includes 20,400 visitors for the United Kingdom. Province of entry data for June shows that the majority of overseas visitors entered in Ontario, Quebec, or British Columbia and accounted for 90 per cent of total entries. Further disaggregation shows that Montreal and Toronto airports recorded 42,600 (59.2 per cent) visitors in June 1971.

Canadian residents returning direct from overseas countries in June 1971, numbered 78,800, a 10.5 per cent decrease from June last year. As expected, the majority of this total re-entered in either Ontario (31,250 re-entries) or Quebec (29,573 re-entries) and represented 77.2 per cent of aggregate re-entries.
