REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

Cumulative statistics for the first seven months of 1971 indicate that 21,256,400 United States residents entered Canada, an increase of 487,800 (2.3 per cent) entries over last year. Canadian residents returning from visits to the United States numbered 19,832,100, a decrease of 4.0 per cent from a year earlier.

Overseas visitors to Canada during the January – July 1971 period numbered 312,800, a slight increase from a year earlier. Canadian re-entries from overseas countries for the first seven months of this year numbered 556,700, an increase of 3.2 per cent from the previous year. The above statistics further reflect Canada's widening deficit in its travel account balance with overseas countries.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

During the month of July 7,102,900 United States residents entered Canada, a 8.0 per cent increase over last year. This increase entirely results from an increase in automobile traffic. Aggregate statistics for the month of July show that 528,400 (9.3 per cent) more United States visitors entered by automobile than in July last year.

Further disaggregation reveals that United States residents entering by automobile and remaining two or more nights in Canada numbered 2,430,000, a 13.7 per cent increase, whereas those entering and leaving same day numbered 3,225,000, a 7.4 per cent increase.

In the United States non-automobile category 5,200 (0.6 per cent) fewer entries were recorded in July this year than a year ago. This decline resulted from a decrease in plane, boat and rail traffic, though partially offset by a 14.0 per cent increase in bus traffic.

Province of entry data reveals that 75.7 per cent of total United States visitors to Canada entered in either Ontario or Quebec.

During the month of July 4,916,100 Canadian residents re-entered from visits to the United States, a 1.9 per cent decrease from July last year. The majority of those that re-entered travelled by automobile (90.0 per cent). Aggregate automobile statistics indicate that 68,600 (1.5 per cent) fewer Canadian residents re-entered in July this year than in July 1970. Short-term automobile traffic decreased 6.5 per cent, while long-term automobile traffic increased 8.3 per cent from July last year. Length of stay data reveals that 62.9 per cent of aggregate automobile visits to the United States were of a short-term duration.

Canadian residents re-entering by non-automobile transportation in July numbered 493,200, a 5.1 per cent decrease from the previous year. Disaggregation by type of transportation shows that the largest decrease occurred in the "Other travellers" category. This category which includes persons re-entering by local bus, taxi, motorcycles, commercial truck, etc. recorded 27,000 fewer re-entries in July than for the same month a year earlier. The most significant change in relative terms, an 87.5 per cent decline, occured in the rail category. This decline primarily results from a decrease in the demand for rail service as is evident by the closure of such service through various ports across Canada.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Overseas visitors to Canada for the period January — July 1971 numbered 312,800, a 1.0 per cent increase from a year earlier, while Canadian residents returning direct from visits to overseas countries over the same interval numbered 556,700, a 3.2 per cent increase.

During the month of July 114,500 overseas visitors entered Canada, a 9.0 per cent increase above July last year. Disaggregation reveals that there were significant increases in the number of overseas visitors from the United Kingdom, Germany, the Netherlands, Japan and Trinidad and Tobago. Province of entry data shows that 77.7 per cent of overseas visitors to Canada entered in either Ontario or Quebec. The province of Ontario received 67.0 per cent of all United Kingdom visitors and 50.5 per cent of all visitors from Germany, while British Columbia recorded 54.8 per cent of all Japanese resident entries to Canada.

Canadian residents returning direct from visits to overseas countries in July 1971 numbered 118,300, a slight increase from the previous year. Following previous patterns, the majority of Canadians re-entered in Ontario (52.3 per cent) or Quebec (28.4 per cent). Port of re-entry data shows that the majority of Canadians re-entered at either Toronto or Montreal International Airport.
