TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA THE UNITED STATES AND OTHER COUNTRIES

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REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

Cumulative statistics for the first eight months of 1971 reveal that 28.2 million United States visitors entered Canada, a 2.4 % increase from the first eight months last year. Canadian residents returning from visits to the United States numbered 24.6 million, a 4.3 % decrease from a year earlier. This decrease in the number of Canadian re-entries results entirely from a decline in same day automobile traffic. Translated directly in terms of receipts and payments this decrease can be misleading as short-term traffic tends to generate less income than traffic of a long-term nature.

Overseas visitors to Canada during the January — August 1971 period totalled 393,700, a slight increase from a year earlier, while Canadians returning direct from visits overseas over the same period numbered 730,300, a 4.0 % increase from the previous year.

On August 15th, 1971 the United States announced measures to alleviate its balance of payments problem. Although the impact of these measures on travel will not be known for some time, it is likely that travel patterns and expenditures will be altered somewhat. In addition to this the lack of agreement at the recent IATA meeting to ratify new air fare structures could have an effect on travel expenditures and patterns as well.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

In August 1971, 6.9 million United States visitors entered Canada, a 2.6 % increase from August last year. The largest increase in both relative and absolute terms occurred in the same day automobile category, as 131,500 (4.2 %) more United States visitors were recorded in August this year. United States long-term automobile traffic increased by 69,110 (3.3 %) entries from last year. In the non-automobile category decreases in the numbers of United States visitors by plane, rail and boat were recorded. These decreases were partly offset by an increase in bus traffic.

Province of entry data shows that the majority of United States visitors to Canada entered in Ontario or Quebec, and recorded 61.1~% and 14.9~% of aggregative entries respectively. This proportion was similar to that recorded in August 1970.

Aggregate statistics for August 1971 reveal that 4.7 million Canadian residents returned from visits to the United States, a 5.5 % decrease from last year. This decrease is primarily attributable to the decline in the same day automobile category. Statistics show that 89.1 % of total re-entries in August were by automobile. In the non-automobile category, plane and bus traffic recorded increases; while decreases occurred in aggregate rail and boat traffic. Province of re-entry data shows that in August 32.9 % and 33.8 % of Canadians returning from the United States re-entered in Ontario and Quebec respectively.

A summary of non-resident vehicles entering Canada shows that 9.7 million entries were recorded during the first eight months of this year, a slight increase from last year. In August 1971, 2.2 million non-resident vehicles entered Canada, a 1.3 % increase from a year earlier.

Canadian vehicles returning to Canada from the United States during the period January — August 1971 numbered 8.9 million, a 3.7 % decrease from the previous year. Monthly data shows that 1.6 million re-entered during the month of August, a 5.1 % decrease from a year earlier.

TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OVERSEAS COUNTRIES

Overseas visitors entering Canada during August 1971 totalled 80,200, a slight decrease from August last year. Country of residence data which is derived from the IMM 700 and aggregated by the department of Immigration reveals that the six leading countries in terms of visitors to Canada during August were: United Kingdom, France, Germany, Japan, the Netherlands, and Italy in that order. An areal disaggregation shows that 67.2 % of total overseas visitors were from Europe; and that 43.9 % of this total were from the United Kingdom. Province of entry data shows that 80.0 % of overseas visitors to Canada entered in either Quebec or Ontario with the latter accounting for a slightly higher proportion.

Canadian residents returning directly from visits to overseas in August 1971 numbered 173,500, a $6.8\,\%$ increase from August last year. Province of re-entry data shows that $82.0\,\%$ of returning residents re-entered in either Quebec or Ontario. As expected, the majority of Canadians re-entered by plane.
