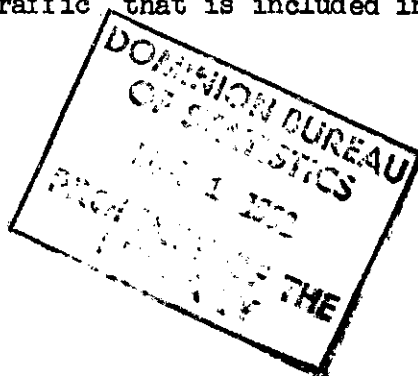
VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA
ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS
JANUARY, 1962

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits in January totalled 244,040, a decrease of 11,758 entries or 4.6 per cent when compared with the same month of 1961. Entries into the Atlantic Provinces and Quebec were heavier than the previous year but all other provinces recorded a decrease.
