VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS JANUARY, 1963

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits during the month of January, 1963 numbered 251,036. Although this represents an increase of 6,996 entries or 2.9 per cent when compared with 1962, it is 4,762 or 2.1 per cent fewer than the record for the month of January which was established in 1961. All provinces shared in the increase with the exception of the Atlantic Provinces and Alberta.
