VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA  
ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS  
OCTOBER - 1964PROPERTY OF THE  
LIBRARY

Travellers' vehicle permits issued for the admission of foreign vehicles into Canada in October numbered 553,462, an increase of 31,240 or 6.0 per cent above October 1963. Cumulative data for the first ten months of 1964 show a gain of 476,539 entries or 7 per cent over the corresponding period of 1963.
