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## VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERIOTE TISTICS

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Travellers' vehicle permits issued for the admission of foreign vehicles into canada in October numbered 586,643, an increase of 33,110 or 6.0 per cent over 1964 when the previous record fo the month was established. Cumulative data for the first ten months of 1965 show 7,586,999 permits issued, an increase of 300,433 or 4.1 per cent over the same period of 1964 and establishes a new record for the ten month period.
