

## VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS

DECEMBER 1965

Travellers' vehicle permits issued to admit foreign vehicles into Canada in December numbered 418,229 as compared with 355,251 in December 1964, an increase of 62,978 or nearly 18 per cent. Cumulative data for the 1965 calendar year show a new record of 8,462,398 permits issued, an increase of 395,136 or 4.9 per cent over the year 1964.
