PERMITS

Travellers' vehicle permits issued for the admission of foreign vehicles into Canada in March 1965 numbered 342,268, a decrease of 28,189 or 7.6 per cent below the same month of 1964. The change in the Easter week-end from March in 1964 to April in 1965 may have contributed to this decline. Cumulative data for the first quarter show entries of 931,323, a decrease of 65,803 or 6.6 per cent when compared with 1964.
