VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS

JULY 1965

Travellers' vehicle permits issued to foreign vehicles entering Canada in July numbered 1,572,510, an increase of 113,968 or 7.8 per cent over the same month of 1964. This constitutes a new record for the month of July and also represents the highest percentage increase to date in 1965. Cumulative data for the first seven months show a gain of 141,587 entries or 3.1 per cent.
