Travellers' vehicle permits issued to admit foreign vehicles into Canada numbered 362,257 in February 1966, an increase of 68,241 or 23 per cent over the same month of 1965. Entries for the first two months totalled 704,962, an increase of 115,907 or 19.7 per cent above the corresponding period in 1965.
