VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS

The number of foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in August 1948, was 0.3 per cent lower than in the same month last year, and 22.7 per

in August 1948, was 0.3 per cent lower than in the same month last year, and 22.7 per cent higher than in August 1946. When compared to August 1947, decreases were recorded in Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia, and increases in all other provinces. Labour Day week-end in the current year fell on September 4, 5, and 6, whereas in the preceding year it fell on August 30, 31, and September 1. Hence the heavy flow of traffic entering Canada for the holiday occurred in August in 1947 and in September in 1948. Had it not been for this fact, volume of traffic in August would have been higher in 1948 than in 1947. Traffic in the first eight months of the current year was 7.1 per cent higher than in the corresponding period in 1947.
