Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in September, 1948, totalled 253,564, an increase of 27.5 per cent over the same month in 1947 , The increase was largely due to a heavy inflow of cars for the Labour Day holidays, and more than made up for a small decrease recorded in August. Traffic was heavier than last year through ports of entry in all provinces except Nova Scotia.

During the first nine months of the year the number of vehicles entering Canada on permits was $1,573,434$, an increase of 9.9 per cent over the same period in 1947, and more than the total number of vehicles entering in the whole of the year 1946.
