VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS

DECEMBER, 1950

More than two million foreign vehicles entered Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in 1950. The number of entries, which excludes repeat trips by summer residents and commuters, was 2,060,048, representing an increase of 3.5 per cent over the previous high in 1949.

Foreign entries in December totalled 58,100, a gain of 4 per cent over the same

month last year.
