VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS MAY, 1950

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in May totalled 144,600, a drop of 6 per cent from the same month last year. There were decreases in the volume of traffic entering all provinces except New Brunswick, and the aggregate decline on a percentage basis was the largest since April, 1947. Totals for the first five months were up 1 per cent as compared to a corresponding gain for the same period last year of 13 per cent.
