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JULY 1967

Entries of vehicles registered in other countries totalled 2,146,934 in July, an increase of 253,525 or 13.4 per cent over July 1966. Substantial increases were recorded for Quebec (182.5 per cent) and Manitoba (31.6 per cent) reflecting the influence of Expo and the Pan American games. No doubt, the curtailment of international travel in the Windsor - Detroit area during the latter part of the month contributed to the decline for Ontario. Cumulative data for the first seven months show an increase of 707,008 entries, of which 581,334 or 82 per cent was in the province of Quebec.
