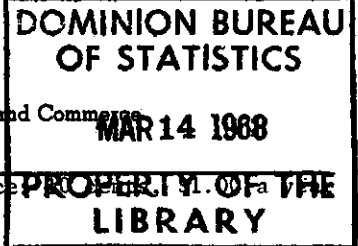

JANUARY 1968

Entries of vehicles registered in other countries totalled 550,607 in January, an increase of 63,561 or 13.1 per cent over January 1967. This represents a new record for the first month of the year. Percentage-wise the greatest gains were in Quebec and Manitoba, where entries advanced more than 25 per cent over last year.
