Entries of vehicles registered in other countries numbered 598,289 in February, an increase of 33,225 or 5.9 per cent over last year. It should be noted that provinces showing the greatest increases had substantial declines in 1969. Comparing 1970 with 1968 the increase for British Columbia was 8,810 or 20.1 per cent and for Saskatchewan there was a gain of 274 or 6.9 per cent.
