A total of $2,084,120$ vehicles registered in other countries entered Canada during the month of August 1970, a decrease of 0.6 per cent below the 1969 figure. Vehicles remaining one or more nights numbered 902,691 , an increase of 1.7 per cent. Total cumulative data for the period January to August is 3.2 per cent above last years total while long-term traffic has increased 6.6 per cent.
