FEBRUARY 1971

A total of 547,548 vehicles entered Canada in February 1971, a decrease of 8.5 per cent over the same period last year. This decrease may be due to the severe winter conditions experienced by the Province of Ontario this year, with total traffic decreasing substantially at Fort Erie and Windsor. Long-term traffic increased by 2.2 per cent for the period January — February, 1971.
