BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF 1937.

Live births in Canada during the second quarter of 1937 numbered 57,312 (preliminary figures) giving an equivalent annual rate of 20.7 per 1,000 population as compared with 57,580 births and a rate of 21.0 for the second quarter of 1936. There were 2,310 illegitimate births forming 4.0 per cent of all live births, as compared with 2,464 or 4.3 per cent for the corresponding period of 1936. Stillbirths amounted to 1,611 or 2.7 per cent of all births as against 1,683 and a rate of 2.8 per cent.

Deaths totalled 27,459 with a rate of 9.9 per 1,000 population as compared with 27,294 and the same rate.

The natural increase for the quarter was 29,853, giving a rate of 10.8 per 1,000 population, as against 30,286 or a rate of 11.1.

Deaths under one year of age numbered 3,737 and the infant mortality rate was 65 per 1,000 live births. These figures compared with 3,758 deaths and the same rate in the corresponding period of 1936. Deaths under one month of age numbered 2,010 giving a rate of 35 per 1,000 live births as against 2,061 and a rate of 36. There were 307 maternal deaths as compared with 331 and the rate was 5.4 as against 5.7 per 1,000 live births.

The number of deaths assigned to certain causes in the second quarter of 1937 was as follows (the figures for the corresponding period of 1936 being given in parentheses in each case): Typhoid and paratyphoid fever, 37 (61); Small-pox, 1 (-); Measles, 226 (108); Scarlet fever, 66 (54); Whooping-cough, 174 (135); Diphtheria, 51 (47); Influenza, 968 (830); Infantile paralysis, 14 (7); Tuberculosis, 1,871 (1,968); Cancer, 2,952 (2,891); Diseases of the heart, 4,152 (4,165); Diseases of the arteries, 2,408 (2,372); Pneumonia, 1,918 (1,912); Diarrhoea and enteritis, 479 (482); Nephritis, 1,696 (1,655); Suicide, 256 (256); Homicide, 30 (36); Automobile accidents, 351 (271); Other violent deaths, 1,128 (1,068);

There were 22,773 marriages giving a rate of 8.2 as against 21,029 or a rate of 7.7 in the second quarter of 1936.

For the first six months of 1937 the figures are as follows, with those for the corresponding period of 1936 in parentheses:- Live births, 109,992 (113,267); Birth rate, 20.0 (20.7); Illegitimate births, 4,531 (4,878); Per cent of total live births, 4.1 (4.3); Stillbirths, 3,197 (3,342); Per cent of total births 2.8 (2.9); Deaths, 59,479 (55,848); Death rate, 10.8 (10.2); Natural increase 50,513 (57,419); Rate of natural increase 9.2 (10.5); Deaths under one year, 8,301 (7,622); Rate per 1,000 live births, 75 (67); Deaths under one month, 4,082 (4,039); Rate per 1,000 live births, 37 (36); Maternal deaths, 601 (676); Rate per 1,000 live births, 5.5 (6.0); Marriages, 35,512 (32,851); Marriage rate 6.4 (6.0).

Deaths from certain causes for the six months were as follows: Typhoid and paratyphoid fever, 79 (121); Smallpox, 2 (2); Measles, 526 (243); Scarlet fever, 151 (136); Whooping-cough, 368 (309); Diphtheria, 127 (112); Influenza, 4,331 (2,193); Infantile paralysis, 23 (20); Tuberculosis, 3,631 (3,691); Cancer, 5,882 (5,828); Diseases of the heart, 8,817 (8,617); Diseases of the arteries, 5,089 (4,830); Pneumonia, 4,759 (4,288); Diarrhoea and enteritis, 872 (936); Nephritis, 3,526 (3,402); Suicide, 481 (485); Homicide, 68 (81) Automobile accidents, 576 (418); Other violent deaths, 2,077 (1,975).




