BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES IN THE THIRD QUARTER OF 1937.

Live births in Canada during the third quarter of 1937 numbered 55,373 (preliminary figures) giving an equivalent annual rate of 19.8 per 1,000 population, as compared with 56,331 births and a rate of 20.3 for the third quarter of 1936. There were 1,927 illegitimate births forming 3.5 per cent of all live births, as compared with 2,043 or 3.6 per cent for the corresponding period of 1936. Stillbirths amounted to 1,519 or 2.7 per cent of all births as against 1,523 and a rate of 2.6 per cent.

Deaths totalled 25,924 with a rate of 9.3 per 1,000 population, as compared with 24,653 and a rate of 8.9.

The natural increase for the quarter was 29,449 giving a rate of 10.5 per 1,000 population, as against 31,678 or a rate of 11.4.

Deaths under one year of age numbered 4,434 and the infant mortality rate was 80 per 1,000 live births. These figures compared with 3,127 deaths and a rate of 56 in the corresponding period of 1936. Deaths under one month of age numbered 1,601 giving a rate of 29 per 1,000 live births as against 1,607 and the same rate. There were 222 maternal deaths as compared with 280 and the rate was 4.0 as against 5.0 per 1,000 live births.

The number of deaths assigned to certain causes in the third quarter of 1937 was as follows (the figures for the corresponding period of 1936 being given in parentheses in each case): Typhoid and paratyphoid fever, 97 (79); Small-pox - (-); Measles, 106 (53); Scarlet fever, 38 (41); Whooping-cough, 192 (139); Diphtheria, 86 (49); Influenza, 243 (227); Infantile paralysis, 135 (36); Tuberculosis 1,552 (1,624); Cancer, 2,945 (2,897); Diseases of the heart, 3,541 (3,608); Diseases of the arteries, 2,039 (2,028); Pneumonia, 879 (997); Diarrhoea and enteritis, 2,425 (807); Nephritis, 1,387 (1,404); Suicide, 263 (217); Homicide, 26 (25); Automobile accidents, 579 (494); Other violent deaths, 1,429 (2,087).

There were 27,179 marriages giving a rate of 9.7 as against 24,931 or a rate of 9.0 in the third quarter of 1936.

For the first nine months of 1937 the figures are as follows with those for the corresponding period of 1936 in parentheses:- Live births, 166,653 (169,598); Birth rate, 20.1 (20.6); Illegitimate births, 6,581 (6,921); per cent of total live births, 3.9 (4.1); Stillbirths, 4,768 (4,865); per cent of total births, 2.8 (2.8); Deaths, 85,856 (80,501); Death rate, 10.3 (9.8); Natural increase, 80,797 (89,097); Rate of natural increase, 9.8 (10.8); Deaths under one year, 12,831 (10,749); Rate per 1,000 live births, 77 (63); Deaths under one month, 5,734 (5,646); Rate per 1,000 live births, 34 (33); Maternal deaths, 830 (956); Rate per 1,000 live births, 5.0 (5.6); Marriages, 62,875 (57,782); Marriage rate 7.6 (7.0).

Deaths from certain causes for the nine months were as follows: Typhoid and paratyphoid fever, 180 (200); Small-pox, 2 (2); Measles, 643 (296); Scarlet fever, 191 (177); Whooping-cough, 561 (448); Diphtheria, 211 (161); Influenza 4,600 (2,420); Infantile paralysis, 156 (56); Tuberculosis 5,227 (5,315); Cancer, 8,866 (8,725); Diseases of the heart 12,414 (12,225); Diseases of the arteries, 7,147 (6,858); Pneumonia 5,687 (5,285); Diarrhoea and enteritis, 3,301 (1,743); Nephritis, 4,936 (4,806); Suicide, 751 (702); Homicide, 96 (106); Automobile accidents, 1,160 (912); Other violent deaths, 3,531 (4,062).
