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BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1938.

Live births in Canada during the first quarter of 1938 numbered 54,711 (preliminary figures) giving an equivalent annual rate of 19.8 per 1,000 population, as compared with 53,214 births and a rate of 19.4 for the first quarter of 1937. There were 2,338 illegitimate births forming 4.3 per cent of all live births, as compared with 2,285 and the same rate. Stillbirths amounted to 1,569 or 2.8 per cent of all births as against 1,603 and a rate of 2.9 per cent.

Deaths totalled 28,395 with a rate of 10.3 per 1,000 population as compared with 32,242 and a rate of 11.8.

The natural increase for the quarter was 26,316 giving a rate of 9.5 per 1,000 population as against 20,972 or a rate of 7.6.

Deaths under one year of age numbered 3,939 and the infant mortality rate was 72 per 1,000 live births. These figures compared with 4,629 deaths and a rate of 87 in the corresponding period of 1937. Deaths under one month of age numbered 1,943 giving a rate of 36 per 1,000 live births as against 2,104 and a rate of 40. There were 243 maternal deaths as compared with 297, and the rate was 4.4 as against 5.6 per 1,000 live births.

The number of deaths assigned to certain causes in the first quarter of 1938 was as follows (the figures for the corresponding period of 1937 being given in parentheses in each case): Typhoid and paratyphoid fever, 62 (42); Small-pox, 2 (1); Measles, 95 (313); Scarlet fever, 78 (86); Whooping-cough, 155 (195); Diphtheria, 120 (76); Influenza, 1,053 (3,392); Infantile paralysis, 13 (9); Tuberculosis, 1,521 (1,785); Cancer, 2,868 (2,942); Cerebral haemorrhage, cerebral embolism and thrombosis, 542 (562); Diseases of the heart, 4,752 (4,689); Diseases of the arteries, 2,570 (2,691); Pneumonia, 2,570 (2,876); Diarrhoea and enteritis, 456 (395); Nephritis, 1,741 (1,839); Suicide, 219 (225); Homicide, 34 (40); Automobile accidents, 230 (225); Other violent deaths, 987 (954).

There were 12,684 marriages giving a rate of 4.6 as against 12,792 or a rate of 4.7 in the first quarter of 1937.
