

BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES IN THE THIRD QUARTER OF 1938.

Live births in Canada during the third quarter of 1938 numbered 57,797 (preliminary figures) giving an equivalent annual rate of 20.5 per 1,000 population as compared with 56,983 births and a rate of 20.4 for the third quarter of 1937. There were 2,031 illegitimate births forming 3.5 per cent of all live births, as compared with 2,036 and a rate of 3.6. Stillbirths amounted to 1,555 or 2.6 per cent of all births as against 1,554 and a rate of 2.7 per cent.

Deaths totalled 24,033 with a rate of 8.5 per 1,000 population as compared with 26,330 and a rate of 9.4.

The natural increase for the quarter was 33,764 giving a rate of 12.0 per 1,000 population, as against 30,653 or a rate of 11.0.

Deaths under one year of age numbered 3,285 and the infant mortality rate was 57 per 1,000 live births. These figures compared with 4,517 deaths and a rate of 79 in the corresponding period of 1937. Deaths under one month of age numbered 1,591 giving a rate of 28 per 1,000 live births as against 1,635 and a rate of 29. There were 251 maternal deaths as compared with 230 and the rate was 4.3 as against 4.0 per 1,000 live births.

The number of deaths assigned to certain causes in the third quarter of 1938, was as follows (the figures for the corresponding period of 1937 being given in parentheses in each case): Typhoid and paratyphoid fever, 55 (97); Small-pox, - (-); Measles, 44 (116); Scarlet fever, 26 (38); Whooping-cough, 100 (191); Diphtheria, 91 (86); Influenza, 207 (249); Infantile paralysis, 39 (143); Tuberculosis, 1,420 (1,579); Cancer, 3,055 (2,980); Cerebral haemorrhage, cerebral embolism and thrombosis, 452 (444); Diseases of the heart, 3,623 (3,579); Diseases of the arteries 2,198 (2,066); Pneumonia, 1,001 (898); Diarrhoea and enteritis, 997 (2,454); Nephritis, 1,369 (1,407); Suicide, 230 (265); Homicide, 28 (29); Automobile accidents, 473 (586); Other violent deaths, 1,363 (1,466).

There were 26,100 marriages giving a rate of 9.2 as against 27,358 or a rate of 9.8 in the third quarter of 1937.

For the first nine months of 1938 the figures are as follows, with those for the corresponding period of 1937 in parentheses:- Live births, 172,573 (169,021); Birth rate, 20.6 (20.3); Illegitimate births, 6,986 (6,771); Per cent of total live births, 4.0 (4.0); Stillbirths, 4,751 (4,822); Per cent of total births, 2.7 (2.8); Deaths 79,529 (86,514); Death rate, 9.5 (10.4); Natural increase, 93,044 (82,507); Rate of natural increase, 11.1 (9.9); Deaths under one year, 10,946 (12,988); Rate per 1,000 live births, 63 (77); Deaths under one month 5,519 (5,808); Rate per 1,000 live births, 32 (34); Maternal deaths, 747 (845); Rate per 1,000 live births, 4.3 (5.0); Marriages, 62,925 (63,114); Marriage rate 7.5 (7.6);

Deaths from certain causes for the nine months were as follows: Typhoid and paratyphoid fever, 154 (181); Small-pox, 1 (2); Measles, 213 (682); Scarlet fever, 148 (191); Whooping-cough, 390 (562); Diphtheria, 286 (211); Influenza, 1,838 (4,623); Infantile paralysis, 63 (164); Tuberculosis 4,677 (5,283); Cancer, 8,901 (8,912); Cerebral haemorrhage, embolism and thrombosis, 1,476 (1,489); Diseases of the heart, 12,758 (12,479); Diseases of the arteries, 7,372 (7,192); Pneumonia, 5,469 (5,740); Diarrhoea and enteritis, 1,961 (3,331); Nephritis, 4,851 (4,960); Suicide, 724 (755); Homicide, 101 (101); Automobile accidents, 1,021 (1,175); Other violent deaths, 3,501, (3,567).




