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## FOREWORD

The Statistics of Births, Deaths and Marriages presented in this Bulletin for November, 1921 are only preliminary and are subject to revision in the Annual Report. In comparing the reports by months it should be remembered that the 1920 monthly reports represent figures corrected up to the end of the year, while those for 1921 are provisional.

## GENERAL SUMMARY

### BIRTHS

A total of 12,253 births was reported for the Registration area of Canada during November 1921. This gives a crude birth rate of 1.9 per 1000 estimated population. In November of the previous year, 11,688 births were reported, a rate of 1.8 per 1000 estimated population.

### Plural, Illegitimate and Stillbirths.

Plural Births: There were 135 pairs of twins and two sets of triplets registered for November 1921, in the Vital Statistics Registration Area, a rate of 11 per 1000 single births. November 1920 gave a return of 133 pairs of twins and four sets of triplets, a rate of 12 per 1000 single births for the same Area.

Illegitimate Births: The ratio of illegitimate births to total births was 18 per 1000 living births for November, as against 17 per 1000 living births in the same month of 1920.

Stillbirths: In November 1921 there were reported for the provinces included in the Registration Area, 493 stillbirths, a rate of 40 per 1000 living births, as against a total of 466 and a rate of 40 per 1000 single births in November of the preceding year.

## MARRIAGES

A total of 4636 marriages was registered in the eight co-operating provinces during November 1921. This is a decrease over November 1920, when there were 5516 marriages registered in the same area. Additional information may be found in Table 111.

## MORTALITY

The reports received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics from the Registration Area of the Dominion indicate a total mortality of 5229 for November 1921, or a rate of .8 per 1000 estimated population, which is the same rate as was shown for the month of October. In November 1920 there were 5439 deaths reported, or a rate of .9 per 1000 estimated population.
