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
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FOREWORD

The Statistics of Births, Deaths and Marriages presented in this bulletin are only preliminary and are subject to revision in the Annual Report. In comparing the reports by months it should be remembered that the 1920 monthly reports represent figures corrected up to the end of that year, while those for 1921 are provisional.

GENERAL SUMMARY.

BIRTHS.

Births reported for May by eight provinces totalled 14,422, with a crude rate per 1000 estimated population of 2.2, the same rate as shown for March and April.

The following statement gives, by Provinces, the total births and crude rates per 1000 estimated population, for the month.

The highest provincial birth rate was secured by New Brunswick with 2.5 per 1000 estimated population as against the 2.8 per 1000 registered by that province in May 1920.

With the exception of Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick the highest birth rates were recorded in the cities and towns. British Columbia shows the lowest birth rate based on estimated population. In May 1920, 14,780 births were reported with a crude birth rate of 2.3 per thousand.

Plural, Illegitimate and Stillbirths.

Twins to the number of 172 sets and 3 sets of triplets were recorded in the eight provinces for May 1921, amongst 14,244 mothers, giving a rate of 1 plural birth to 81 mothers. In May 1920 there were 193 plural births (191 twins and 2 triplets) amongst 14,585 mothers, or a rate of 1 plural birth to 75 mothers.

Illegitimate births totalled 307 for the Dominion (exclusive of Quebec) during May 1921, a rate of 21 per 1000 total births. The highest rate was in Prince Edward Island with 40 per 1000 total births. British Columbia was lowest with eleven illegitimate births or thirteen per 1000 living births. In May 1920 there were 287 illegitimate births for the Dominion or a rate of 19 per 1000 living births.

Stillbirths numbered 544 for the eight co-operating provinces for May, a rate of 38 per 1000 living births as against 533 in May 1920 as a rate of 36 per 1000 living births. Nova Scotia holds the highest rate for the provinces of 51 per 1000 living births. In May 1920 Ontario had the highest rate, 44 per 1000 living births.

MARRIAGES.

Classified for cities, towns and rural communities are given in Table III.

MORTALITY

Mortality during May 1921, as reported by eight provinces, totalled 5592, a crude rate of .8 per estimated population. The mortality rate in May 1920 was 1.0 per 1000 population or total deaths numbering 6515 for the eight provinces.

Highest death rates were recorded in Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick with 1.1 per 1000 estimated population; in May 1920, Nova Scotia and Ontario held the highest rate, 1.2 per 1000 estimated population. Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia each gave a mortality crude rate of .6 per 1000 estimated population.

Tuberculosis (all forms) shows a decrease of 84 deaths over May of 1920, but an increase of 20 over April 1921. Deaths reported from this disease totalled 463 for May 1921 as against 547 deaths in May 1920. Last month there were 443 deaths.

CANCER - Deaths from cancer (all forms) for May 1921 totalled 413, or one out of every 13 total deaths.

INFANTILE MORTALITY.

Deaths of infants under one year of age totalled 1083 for eight provinces during May 1921, a rate of 75 per 1000 living births. In May 1920 there were 1407 deaths of infants under 1 year of age or a rate of 95 per 1000 living births. Statistics are given on Table VI.

Of the 1083 infants who died in the first year of life during May of the present year, 437, or 40 per cent of the total died in the first week of life while those who died in the first month of life totalled 641 or 59 per cent of the total.
