

## PREFACE

This is a special report that aims to facilitate the analysis of change in the distribution of Canadian incomes between 1965 and 1967. It is similar in content to the summary report Catalogue No. 13-529 *Income Distributions, Incomes of Non-farm Families and Individuals in Canada, Selected Years 1951-1965*. The scope of the present report, however, has been expanded by including farmers and thus covering all Canadian families and individuals.

The series will be extended as data for future years become available. Data for 1969 are being processed at present. Starting with 1971, Surveys of Consumer Finances will be undertaken on an annual basis, and plans are to publish an annual series of quintile data as well as constant dollar income distributions based on the most current year. The current publication is in a way an interim report and the constant dollar distributions presented in 1961 dollars will later be republished after tabulating the data in terms of 1969 or 1971 dollars.

This report was prepared by the Consumer Finance Research Staff of the Socio-Economic Statistics Branch.

## INTRODUCTION

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics has taken household surveys since the early 1950's in order to estimate the income distribution of families and individuals by income size and various socio-economic characteristics. Reports on income distributions going back to 1951 have been published for selected individual years.<sup>1</sup> In order to facilitate the historical comparisons and analysis of income change, a summary report was published in 1969, Catalogue No. 13-529 *Income Distributions, Incomes of Non-farm Families and Individuals in Canada, Selected Years 1951-1965*. In addition to a summary of income distributions on a current dollar basis, this report presented a selection of tables expressed in 1961 dollars as well as tables by income quintiles.

The two latter forms of presentation are continued in the current report and 1967 data has been added. However, the following difference should be noted—data in the current report cover all families and individuals living in private households whereas the above-mentioned summary report was restricted to non-farm families and individuals. Coverage of Surveys of Consumer Finances was extended to farmers and their families starting 1965. Differences found in the 1965 data (when the two reports are compared) are due to the inclusion of farmers and their families in the current report.

Current dollar tables are not repeated in this report and readers are referred for this information as well as for a more thorough description of the technical and conceptual aspects of the surveys to *Income Distributions by Size in Canada, 1965* and *1967*, Catalogue Nos. 13-528 and 13-534 respectively.

Survey data were used to prepare estimates of income distributions of individuals in receipt of money income in the reference year as well as distributions of all family units by size of income. The latter distributions were compiled by grouping related individuals living in the same household into one unit. The resulting units may consist of one person or groups of related individuals, so family units are subdivided into two further categories—unattached individuals and families. Both sections of the report consist of two parts, the first one dealing with individuals in receipt of money income, the second with families and unattached individuals.

Section I of the report presents distributions by size of income in terms of constant (1961) dollars. The Consumer Price Index was used to deflate the incomes of individuals and families in the two surveys and new distributions were compiled from these rebased income figures. Part I of Section I contains Tables 1A to 9 which describe the change in real income of individuals over the period 1965-67. These tables show separate distributions for males, females and all individuals. In addition, most tables also contain a distribution of wage-

earners, i.e., a group of individuals—males and females—whose major source of income during the reference year came from wages or salaries.

Tables 10A to 23 comprise Part II of Section I and present data on income distributions of family units in constant (1961) dollars. Most tables show separate distributions for families and unattached individuals as well as combined data for all units. Tables 20 to 23 focus on families only and present data by such family characteristics as family size, type, number of children.

Section II contains tables that describe the compositions of income quintiles. Individuals and family units were ranked by size of their income in current dollars and the resulting arrays were divided into five equal parts; percentage distributions describe the composition of each quintile in terms of the individuals or family units that make up the quintile. This device allows one to examine, for example, whether over the two-year period a change has occurred in the lowest or highest income quintile, i.e., do the bottom and top group in the income distribution still contain the same kind of people.

Section II is also divided into two parts; Tables 24 to 31 present tables on individuals with income by income quintile, Tables 25 to 43 deal with family units—families and unattached individuals.

Besides describing income changes affecting individuals and families with characteristics such as age and sex of head, place of residence, both sections contain data on the distribution of aggregate income between income size groups or quintiles. These data are basic for calculating measures of inequality, an important aspect of income distribution analysis. Tables showing the income composition or sources of income going to each income group or quintile are also included in both sections.

All estimates in this report are based on data obtained from two sample surveys of households. As is well known, such estimates are subject to sampling and non-sampling errors. Sampling errors are a function of the sample size and the variability in the population. Due to the complex sample design it was impractical to calculate sampling errors for the various statistics in this publication. In order to provide a rough guide to the reliability of the estimates, tables in Section I show the sample size on which each estimated distribution is based. It should be noted that estimates for 1965 were based on a sample less than half the size of that available for the 1967 estimates, because the Survey of Consumer Finances taken in the spring of 1966 sampled only 10,600 households against 26,000 households surveyed in the spring of 1968.<sup>2</sup> This implies (everything else being roughly equal) that the 1967 estimates are more reliable than the data for 1965.

The following section gives a general description of the concepts and definitions used; brief descriptions of the methodology used to obtain constant dollar and quintile estimates are also

supplied. For more detailed technical and conceptual explanations the main reports Catalogue Nos. 13-528 and 13-534 should be consulted.

## NOTES AND DEFINITIONS

Tables presenting income data for individuals are restricted to individuals in receipt of some money income in the respective calendar year; the estimated number of persons with no money income are not shown. However, in the family series families and unattached individuals with no money income are included in the tables. The surveys count cross-sectionally all family units as they exist at the time of the survey. Some of these units may have changed composition since or during the year for which income was collected; some of them may be newly formed units all of whose members belonged to some other family unit and had no income in their own right. Most often such new units without income are unattached individuals. The practices described in this paragraph are by now accepted conventions in income distribution statistics; the United States statistics published by the Bureau of the Census in the Current Population Reports (Series P-60) are collected and published on the same basis.

The **family** is defined as a group of individuals sharing a common dwelling unit and related by blood, marriage or adoption. Thus, all relatives living together were considered to comprise one family unit whatever the degree of family relationship. Aside from single sons and daughters, other relatives most commonly found living in the household were married sons and daughters, and widowed parents. **Unattached individuals** are persons living by themselves or rooming in a household where they are not related to other household members.

In this publication the term **all units** was used as a collective term to describe unattached individuals and families with two or more members.

In both surveys income was collected from all individuals in receipt of income in the sample household in the respective calendar year by means of a self-enumeration questionnaire that specified income components in considerable detail. Total income has been defined to consist of:

1. **Wages and salaries:** gross wages, salaries and commissions received before deductions are made for income tax, unemployment insurance or pension funds. All income in kind is excluded. Military pay which is a minor part of total income is included in wages and salaries.
2. **Net income from self-employment:** net income from self-employment either on own account or from unincorporated business or independent professional practice. Net income from farming is included. One-third of the gross receipts from roomers and boarders is also included in this component.

3. **Investment income:** bond interest, bank interest, dividends, mortgage interest, net rents, estate income, and other investment income.

4. **Transfer payments from government:** municipal, provincial and federal government payments of relief, old age, disability and blind pensions, veterans' pensions and allowances, family allowances, workmen's compensation, and unemployment insurance. Although family allowance payments are made to the mother, the surveys have treated them as part of the income of the father.

5. **Miscellaneous income:** retirement pensions, annuities, alimony and other income items not specified or included in the above components but received on a regular basis.

Receipts of gifts, lump-sum settlements from insurance policies, income tax or pension plan refunds, capital gains and losses, receipts from the sale of assets, and inheritances or bequests were excluded as was all income in kind such as meals or living accommodation.

Although the income concept and the estimation procedures were consistent in the two surveys, it should be noted that there was a minor difference in the collection procedure. For 1965 all persons aged 14 and over residing in sample households were asked to complete an income questionnaire. In spring of 1968, collecting data for 1967 enumerators first determined which household members had received income during the year and income questionnaires were left for these individuals only. There is evidence that the procedure used for collecting 1965 data produced improved estimates of individuals with small incomes, because it may have prodded some people into remembering small amounts of earnings or other irregular income received during the year that the other method would likely have missed. However, the larger sample used for the 1967 Survey made it impractical to distribute and collect back nearly 30,000 schedules with zero income reporting.

Family incomes were compiled by aggregating incomes of family members. Over 70% of unattached individuals and families filed complete income information in the surveys and these records were weighted to obtain the published income estimates in the family unit series. For the individual series all income questionnaires returned by members of "complete" families were used as well as some collected from family members where other members did not complete the questionnaires. A separate weighting procedure was applied to these question-

naires to produce estimates of the individual income distribution.<sup>3</sup>

Individuals and families were classified into subgroups based on their major source of income. **Major source of income** refers to the largest source of total income. All individuals and families whose major source of income came from military pay and allowances were eliminated from the tabulations. These individuals and families were excluded from the estimates because this group of people was only partially covered by the survey anyway, as the sampling scheme was limited to private households and excluded military camps and barracks. The remaining individuals and families were divided into three main groups on the basis of their major source of income:

- (a) Wages and salaries (component 1 above).
- (b) Net income from self-employment (component 2 above).
- (c) Other money income (component 3, 4 or 5 above).

In addition to these three groups, in the family series, a small number of unattached individuals and an even smaller number of families are found who had no money income at all in the respective calendar year. As explained above this is a somewhat artificial result of the enumeration method used.

The group of individuals identified as **wage-earners** in the tables are individuals whose largest source of income during the year was wages and salaries. This is in contrast to another classification—**class of worker**. In these tables individuals or heads of families are classified in terms of their employment status at the time of the survey, and a distinction is made between (i) paid workers who are either employed or unemployed, (ii) self-employed persons who are employers or engaged in own account activities, and (iii) persons not in the labour force.

Income distributions by **place of residence** distinguish between individuals and families who live in **metropolitan centers** (centers with a population of 30,000 and over), and those who live in **non-metropolitan areas** (the rest of the country).

Families are often classified by the personal characteristics of the head such as age, sex, class of worker, educational attainment, immigration status etc. In other cases the family type or composition is used as the classifying variable. Most of these are self-explanatory; it should be mentioned that **number of children** refers to children under sixteen years of age.

**Sample size** is the number of unweighted records on which the estimates are based. All tables

in Section I show the sample size applicable to each estimated distribution. Sample size for quintile tables in Section II was not tabulated, but is roughly equal to about one fifth of the sample size shown for the same population in Section I. For example, estimates about the lowest quintile (or any other quintile) of male income recipients in Tables 25 to 30 are based on approximately 1,900 cases for 1965 and 4,700 cases for 1967—approximately one fifth of total males in the sample obtained by adding the sample size of various categories shown for males in Tables 1A and 1B.

It should be noted that 1967 estimates by immigration status are based on a smaller sample than estimates by other characteristics, because the data were not available for approximately 30 per cent of the original records.<sup>4</sup>

**Constant dollar** estimates in Section I were obtained by converting income reported by individuals and families into 1961 dollars and new distributions were tabulated from the converted income figures applying the same weighting factor to each converted return as had been used to compile current dollar distributions for the main report. Conversion factors were calculated using the Consumer Price Index; this resulted in the following deflation factors being applied to income data for the two years:

1965 .....	.932
1967 .....	.867

**Quintile data** in Section II were compiled by ranking weighted survey returns in ascending order by size of total income (in current dollars). Then the array was divided into five equal parts and five groups or quintiles were examined as to the different characteristics of units in each group.

For both years the exercise of determining quintile points and tabulating each of the five quintiles by different characteristics was performed in the individual series for: male income recipients, female income recipients, all individuals in receipt of income, and wage-earners (persons whose major source of income came from wages and salaries).

In the family unit series quintiles were identified and tabulated for: unattached individuals, families, and all units (unattached and families combined). It should be noted that the exercise of ranking units was performed independently (for these three populations) and the resulting data, e.g., for "all units" in the lowest quintile are not simply the addition of families in the first quintile and unattached individuals in the first quintile. The same is true of "all individuals"—the data by quintiles are not a summation of "males" and "females" within the same quintiles.


