DID YOU KNOW?

Bilateral agriculture and agri-food trade has increased more than 1000% since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

Mexicans who participated in the Canada-Mexico Seasonal Agricultural Workers' Program sent **\$195 M** in remittances home to their families in 2017.



In 2017, Canada was the second largest importer of Mexican agriculture and agri-food products.


