

MARKET SUMMARY

Facsimile machines are classified into four groups by the CCIT (International Telegraph Consultative Committee). The first three groups were defined in a standard set out in 1981. The bulk of machines sold are in group three. These devices work at one minute or less, use digital techniques and use redundancy reduction and bandwidth compression to enhance speed. Provisional standards for group 4 build on this base to include computer network compatibility. Groups one and two use AM and FM techniques.

There are 37 vendors selling 198 different models. The market is very competitive with additional features playing a key role to differentiate products. The market leader is Sharp with an 18 per cent share. Others are Murata with 13 per cent and Canon with 9 per cent.

There are a number of interesting developments in the market for facsimile machines and for support services.

The price of a base machine is now around \$1,000 leading to widespread use in small business and for personal tasks. The mode is a substitute for electronic mail, and is in wider use. With the definition of the group 3 standard, it became possible to perform most facsimile functions through software running on a computer. Peripheral boards for this function are approximately \$500, adding to the appeal of the technology.

Supporting services such as dedicated telephone lines and directories are now in place. Machines intended for public use and operated in a manner similar to a vending machine are now appearing.
