Canadian Trade statistics are classified and published according to the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity and Description Coding System (H.S.), as defined by the Canadian Customs Tariff and Statistical Nomenclature.

Dollar values shown in this report are based on selling price F.O.B. plant, in Canadian dollars. This selling price represents the value paid by the importer, excluding all freight, packing and insurance costs when specified. All trade discounts, when applicable, are also deducted from the selling price.

Rounding

Figures may not add due to rounding.

The Bank of Canada exchange rates were used to convert U.S. imports reported in \$US to \$Cdn.

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I. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This is one of a continuing series of market intelligence reports designed to increase business awareness of the potential existing for production in Canada and to assist businesses and other organizations in their market research of specific products. The detailed information provided in these reports supports studies by organizations seeking to expand existing production lines, change individual product characteristics or engage in new manufacturing investment in Canada. The coverage of a market intelligence report is developed in close consultation with the client, and is tailored to meet their specific requirements. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of competing in a particular market.

This report is based on data from several sources. The following is a list of Harmonized System (H.S.) import commodity codes dealing with twine, cordage, rope and cables. This report deals only with nylon twine, cordage, rope and cables. Other related reports are also listed.

VIII. MARKET OVERVIEW

THE CANADIAN TWINE, CORDAGE AND ROPE INDUSTRY

The Canadian apparent market for cordage was \$87.5 million in 1988. It represents an increase of 33.6 per cent in value between 1985 and 1988 (Corresponding data in terms of kilograms are not available).

Cordage includes string, twine, cord and rope and is made either of natural (manila, sisal or cotton) or synthetic (nylon, polyester, polypropylene and polyethylene) fibres. Nylon, polypropylene and polyethylene are the fibres most commonly used for cordage, accounting for more than 65 per cent of the total Canadian market. These products are sold mainly for marine uses (fishing nets, ropes and other type of nets), for packaging (baler twine) and for commercial end-uses.

The Canadian twine, cordage and rope industry is comprised of 21 manufacturing establishments, employing about 700 workers. Five of these 21 producers account for more than 85 per cent of the Canadian shipments and for more than 65 per cent of the total jobs in this industry.

Domestic shipments were valued at \$46.1 million in 1988, an increase of \$9.3 million (25.3 per cent) during the period 1985-1988. Meanwhile, the value of imports grew to \$41.4 million (44.4 per cent) during the same period and reached \$45.2 million in 1990. Imports of cordage have increased significantly over the last two years, from 18,778 metric tons in 1988 to 22,853 metric tons (21.7 per cent) in 1990. The increase in foreign imports comes mainly from U.S.A., the Republic of Korea, Portugal and the Philippines.
