I. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE



XIII. MARKET OVERVIEW

The Canadian carpet industry comprises 23 companies with 41 establishments employing some 5,897 persons (1988). It produces broadloom carpets, rugs and mats from yarns of man-made and/or natural fibres. Nylon, polypropylene, and polyester, all man-made fibres, are the fibres most commonly used in manufacturing carpet in Canada. Products of the industry are destined for use in residential, commercial, institutional and automotive/aircraft applications.

Between 1987 and 1990, the apparent Canadian market (ACM) for carpet increased by some 3.1 per cent in current dollar value, growing to \$1.1 billion in 1990. Over the same period, shipments by Canadian producers decreased by 14.5 per cent, dropping from \$955 million to an estimated \$817 million. The share of the ACM held by domestic producers dropped from 87.5 per cent in 1987 to 72.6 per cent in 1990. Carpet exports accounted for 9.3 per cent of all shipments by Canadian producers in 1990. In current dollar value, exports increased from \$71 million in 1987 to \$84 million in 1990.

Between 1987 and 1990, carpet imports penetrated the ACM at an accelerated rate, increasing their share of the Canadian market from 12.5 per cent to 27.4 per cent. In dollar value, imports grew from \$136 million in 1987 to \$308 million in 1990. The growth of carpet imports originating in the United States is noteworthy. Whereas U.S. imports accounted for 44 per cent of all carpet imports in 1987, they accounted for 74.4 per cent in 1990, increasing in absolute value from \$60 million to \$229 million.

Over the past decade, the Canadian carpet industry has faced and responded to important challenges to its continued viability. Soft market conditions and increasing pressures from imports in recent years, following a period of exceptional growth in the mid-1980s, have accelerated the industry's efforts to improve its competitiveness. The industry has experienced extensive restructuring which, in part, has resulted from the consolidation of production and closure of inefficient operations. As these adjustments continue into the decade ahead, Canadian carpet producers will increasingly depend on well-targetted corporate strategies that focus on developing international competitiveness and achieving growth in the global marketplace.
