EXPLANATORY NOTES

Commodity Classification

Canadian Trade statistics are classified and published according to the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity and Description Coding System (H.S.), as defined by the Canadian Customs Tariff and Statistical Nomenclature.

Valuation

For Customs purposes, imports are recorded at values established according to the provisions of the Customs Act, which, since January 1, 1985, reflects valuation methods based on the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) Valuation Code System. It generally requires the value for duty of imported goods be equivalent to the transaction value or the price actually paid or payable provided that a number of conditions are met. One of the important conditions is that the buyer and seller must be independent of each other. If the conditions are not met, practical rules are used to determine the Customs value. Therefore, Canadian imports are valued Free on Board (F.O.B.), place of direct shipment to Canada. The Customs value excludes freight and insurance costs in bringing the goods to Canada from the point of direct shipment. Canadian exports to the U.S. are valued F.O.B. point of exit from Canada. Prior to 1990, they were valued F.O.B. place of lading net of freight charges, discounts and allowances.

Rounding

Figures may not add due to rounding.

Canada - U.S. Exchange Rate

The Bank of Canada exchange rates were used to convert U.S. imports reported in \$US to \$Cdn.

Canada - U.S. Reconciliation

Prior to 1989, United States commodity coding was based on the Tariff Schedule of the United States (TSUSA) and comparable data are not available. Starting in January 1989, the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (H.S.) was adopted by the United States. However, Canada and the United States have been exchanging import data only since January 1990 and therefore there may be discrepancies in 1989 between Canadian exports to the United States and United States imports from Canada. As of January 1990, any discrepancy between what Canada reports as exports to the United States and what the United States reports as imports from Canada is minimal resulting from exchange rates.

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INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This is one of a continuing series of market intelligence reports designed to increase business awareness of the potential existing for production in Canada and to assist businesses and other organizations in their market research of specific products. The detailed information provided in these reports supports studies by organizations seeking to expand existing production lines, change individual product characteristics or engage in new manufacturing investment in Canada. It is important to emphasize that this report does not attempt any assessment as to the feasibility of competing in a particular market.

MARKET OVERVIEW

The hospital bed market in Canada is part of the more general Hospital Furniture market and includes beds used in hospitals, homes for the aged, extended care institutions and the home-care sector. Specialty niche-markets can be found within the hospital bed market itself: for example maternity beds, paediatric cribs and ICU beds.

Products range from no-frills box-type beds for prisons and psychiatric hospitals to mid-range nursing home beds and finally to more sophisticated and accessorized manual or electric beds commonly used in hospitals. Variations of design are driven by various factors including the patient's comfort and medical care requirements; the end-user or location of the bed; the needs of the institution and its staff as they relate to safety, ease of use and convenience; and maintenance requirements such as repairs and housekeeping.

Currently there are no mandatory regulations in Canada for the design of hospital beds although there may be a move towards a change in that policy. There are, however, regulations in place governing the design and safety of hospital cribs. Also, electric beds or power accessories have to be CSA-approved before sale. Although there are apparently variations from province to province on internal standards for hospital beds, at the moment there are no common legislated standards Canada-wide.

The medical furniture market is a mature, replacement-oriented market. Cost-cutting measures combined with budget constraints and a lagging economy have made it more difficult to sell to medical institutions. In the replacement of existing beds or the purchase of new ones, buyers will be weighing price and value against reduced budget spending. A growth in the nursing home bed market could be anticipated due to an aging population. A trend towards home-care or out-of-hospital care could also provide greater market opportunities for certain types of less-elaborate hospital-type beds.

Based on feedback from the industry, an estimated 95% of the hospital beds currently used in Canada are imported, largely from major companies in the United States.* However, there are at least three or four smaller independent manufacturers in Canada who appear to have taken up competitive positions in the Canadian bed market. It seems that a higher-quality product, availability of service and/or parts, ability to custom-design beds to meet buyer requirements and the ability to fill market niches in Canada which are not profitable for larger companies have contributed to their market positions.
