





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PREFACE

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TABLE 3.1

Survey Coverage

The following statistics cover establishments primarily engaged in providing telephone services including the construction of telephone lines and the maintenance of equipment and lines. These establishments are classified to Standard Industrial Classification 544 - Telephone Systems. To measure telephone activity more completely in Canada, the survey was extended to include other industrial establishments that have been licensed to provide telephone services. The survey covers all domestic licensed telephone activity including that of NorthwesTel Inc. and Terra Nova Telecommunications Inc.

In Canada, fourteen out of approximately 75 telephone systems account for 98% of the telephone activity. These are:

Newfoundland Telephone Company Limited* The Island Telephone Company Limited* Maritime Telegraph and Telephone Limited* New Brunswick Telephone Company Limited* Bell Canada* Québec-Téléphone Télébec Limitée Northern Telephone Limited Thunder Bay Telecommunications Manitoba Telephone System* Saskatchewan Telecommunications* edmonton telephones Alberta Government Telephones Company.* The following have been designated as government telephone systems:
