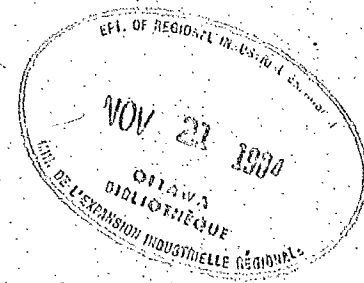



IRDP Annual Report

A. INTRODUCTION

The Minister of Regional Industrial Expansion is required, under Section 15 of the Industrial and Regional Development Act, to report to Parliament by the first day of June following each fiscal year on the administration of the Act. This report includes an explanation of the IRDP, and an analysis of the program's operations and trends over the nine months since its inception until March 31, 1984. The trends which emerge in this report must be viewed as preliminary. As the program matures and a larger number of applications are dealt with, some changes may occur that will alter the original findings.

Explanation of the terms used in administering the Act appears at the end of the report.

The Industrial and Regional Development Act received passage in Parliament with the support of all political parties, and the Minister wishes to express his gratitude to all Members and Senators for this co-operative effort. Royal Assent was given on June 29, 1983, and the program commenced operation in July 1983 when the program regulations came into effect. The IRDP was created as an integral part of the amalgamation of the Departments of Industry, Trade and Commerce (ITC) and Regional Economic Expansion (REE) to form the new Department of Regional Industrial Expansion (DRIE). During the amalgamation process, an extensive review was carried out of financial assistance programs that were previously managed separately. This led to the incorporation of the best features of these former programs into the new IRDP plus the addition of a number of new elements and enhanced flexibility to achieve greater regional sensitivity. The major programs which were subsumed by the new program were the following:

- Enterprise Development Program (EDP)
- Support for Technology Enhanced Productivity (STEP)
- Co-operative Overseas Market Development Program (COMDP)
- Institutional Assistance Program (IAP)
- Regional Development Incentives Act (RDIA)
- Montreal Special Area Program (MSAP)

The objective of the IRDP, which is the principal funded program of the Department of Regional Industrial Expansion (DRIE), is to promote regional industrial development through the support of private sector initiatives with particular emphasis on projects, industries and technologies with the greatest potential for economic return, sustained growth and international competitiveness. The program makes financial assistance available to business and non-profit organizations through grants, contributions, repayable contributions and, in selected and exceptional circumstances, participation loans and loan guarantees. A wide range of projects may be eligible for support under the IRDP including feasibility studies, product and process innovation, new plant establishment, modernization or expansion of existing plant

facilities and infrastructure related to regional industrial development.

Many worthwhile projects fail because assistance is not available in an appropriate form at a specific stage in their development. The IRDP addresses this need by providing a range of financial support over all the phases or elements of a typical corporate development cycle. The elements of the program are:

- Industrial Development Climate
- Innovation
- Establishment
- Modernization/Expansion
- Marketing
- Restructuring

With few exceptions, applications are received and analyzed in the DRIE regional offices, and decision-making for the majority of cases has been decentralized to these offices. The IRDP responds particularly to the needs of small and medium-sized businesses and complements other federal programs and the Federal Business Development Bank.

Two types of applicants are eligible for support under the IRDP:

- Commercial operations, consisting of both manufacturing or processing and tourism operations, which can apply under Innovation, Establishment, Modernization/Expansion and Restructuring. Tourism operations may also apply under Marketing.
- Eligible persons, who are essentially non-profit organizations carrying on activities in support of commercial operations, that can apply under the Industrial Development Climate, Innovation and Marketing.

Although the program is national in scope, financial assistance is available in all regions of Canada based on tier groups into which census divisions are classified. There are four tier groups:

- Tier I consists of the most developed census divisions of the country where approximately 50 per cent of the population live.
- Tier II comprises census divisions that are next in line on the development scale and accounts for approximately 30 per cent of the population.
- Tier III covers the relatively less developed areas and accounts for approximately 15 per cent of the population.
- Tier IV includes the least developed areas in which no more than 5 per cent of the population reside.

Financial assistance under the IRDP is scaled in proportion to the tier group level in which the eligible project is located, i.e. the higher the tier level, the greater the maximum possible assistance. Tier group designations are made according to a 'development index' which is an objective measure of economic disparity in the country based on income, unemployment and provincial fiscal capacity indicators in 260 of Canada's census divisions as provided by Statistics Canada. Tier group designations are reviewed annually on July 1 for possible adjustment depending on changing economic conditions.

To address possible short-term economic downturns in a Tier I census division, where establishment (new facility) support is not normally available, the program provides for one year of Tier II assistance for the Establishment element when the average ratio of unemployment insurance beneficiaries to working-age population in the census division exceeds, by one percentage point, the national average for any consecutive six months.

Development instruments normally take the form of grants, contributions, and specifically or conditionally repayable contributions. The types and levels of assistance vary from element to element within statutory limits and, under some elements, maximum levels increase according to tier group designation. The amount of assistance offered is the estimated minimum necessary to meet the requirements of the project. Particular attention is paid to the capacity utilization in the applicant's industrial sector and impact of the proposed project on other businesses so that the net economic benefits to Canada are maximized with program expenditures. For projects under all elements except Industrial Development Climate, the maximum level of assistance from all government sources, including investment tax credits, cannot exceed 90 per cent of the project costs.

Under the Industrial Development Climate element, projects may receive up to a maximum of 100 per cent of project costs; under the Innovation element, maxima of 50 to 75 per cent of project costs apply according to tier group; maxima for the Establishment element range from 35 to 60 per cent of capital costs according to tier group and for the Modernization/Expansion element from 25 to 50 per cent of capital costs according to tier group; maxima under the Marketing element range from 50 to 90 per cent of project costs according to tier group and project; and under the Restructuring element a maximum repayable contribution of 25 per cent of capital costs is allowed.

The Establishment and Modernization/Expansion elements also require minimum capital costs in a range of \$5 000 to \$100 000 according to tier group and project.

It should be emphasized that although the IRDP represents the major funded program of DRIE, it is not the only program. Other funded programs include the Defence Industry Productivity Program (DIPP), the Small Businesses Loans Act (SBLA), the Canadian Industrial Renewal Board (CIRB), Special ARDA (Agricultural and Rural Development Act) and the Native Economic Development Fund (NEDF). Also, funded programs are only one aspect of DRIE. There are many other non-funded activities carried out by the Department to encourage industrial development and trade promotion in all regions of Canada.

It should be noted that applications for financial assistance and supporting documentation received under the IRDP and other departmental programs contain information that must be regarded as commercially confidential. For this reason and as a matter of policy, the Department does not make public certain types of data. It is for similar reasons of commercial confidentiality that the Department does not reveal that a particular application has been received unless and until it results in an accepted offer of financial assistance.

B. CHANGES TO IRDP

From inception to March 31, 1984, three major changes to the IRDP have been introduced. These are:

(i) Minimum Thresholds

To make the IRDP more accessible to small business across the country, the minimum investment required to qualify for assistance under the program has been reduced as follows:

Under the Modernization/Expansion element:

(ii) Tier I Special Designation

The criteria for the Tier I Special designation, which allows for the IRDP funding of Establishment projects in Tier I areas, have been changed. The Tier I Special designation is now based on the average of the ratios of unemployment insurance beneficiaries to working-age population for six consecutive months rather than on the individual ratios for each of six consecutive months, which was more stringent. If the average ratio in a census division exceeds the national average by one percentage point or more, the census division qualifies for Tier I Special designation.

(iii) Relocation Projects

Relocation projects were defined as expansion projects through an amendment to the Regulations, thus qualifying them under certain conditions for support in Tier I areas as well as in other tier groups.

C. AREAS FOR FUTURE IMPROVEMENT

Experience with the IRDP so far, as is the case with any new program, has indicated a number of areas where possible improvement in program administration and delivery is desirable. Some of these improvements are noted above. Others relate to the eligibility of tourism operations where a set of policy guidelines has recently been developed to assist in the processing of applications in this area of the program.

The rate of applications received has grown rapidly, causing response times to be longer than desirable. This is due to the newness of the program and efforts are being made to correct this. The rate of turndowns is expected to decline gradually with increased program maturity and better understanding in the business community of the types of projects for which support can be made available.

D. EXPECTED RESULTS

From inception to March 31, 1984, 3 630 applications were received under the IRDP. This figure includes 19 applications originally received under the Regional Development Incentives Act (RDIA) and transferred to the IRDP. In accordance with section 13 of the IRD Act, if an application is made under the RDI Act, which is scheduled to expire on December 31, 1984,

and if the applicant is unable to commence commercial production by the expiry date of the Act, the application may be processed under the new IRD Act. In such cases, the Department can make a contribution to the applicant equivalent to any assistance that might have been authorized under the RDIA.

Of the 3 630 applications received until March 31, 1984, 611 were subsequently withdrawn by applicants, 290 were determined to be legally ineligible under the Act and 571 were rejected as not meeting the basic program criteria. A total of 549 offers were made from inception to the end of March, of which 381 are considered accepted offers. Table 1 provides a summary of the IRDP activity based on applications received and the manner in which they were disposed of during the period from inception to March 31, 1984, for each of the four IRDP tier groups as well as Tier I Special areas.

Table 2 provides a breakdown of the 381 accepted offers by tier and by program element of the IRDP. It can be seen from this table that the largest proportion of accepted offers (about 31 per cent) was in Tier III areas, followed by Tier I where some 29 per cent of accepted offers were made. In terms of the program elements, Table 2 shows that Modernization/Expansion projects represented 53 per cent of total accepted offers. Innovation projects accounted for approximately 22 per cent of these offers, while projects for Establishment of new facilities represented 20 per cent.

The total amount of financial assistance for the 381 accepted offers, which represents financial commitments under the IRDP during the first nine months of the program, is estimated at \$82.6 million as shown in Table 2. It should be emphasized that these financial commitments represent only a part of the annual cash-flow expected to occur in future years. Cash-flows representing commitments under the subsumed programs are not yet reflected in the IRDP allocations for the fiscal year, as they are still made separately. The full impact of activity and financial commitments under these subsumed programs will be gradually transferred to the IRDP cash-flow in the years to come. Furthermore, the volume of activity and the associated cash-flow for the IRDP shown in this report are preliminary. They will gradually increase on a full fiscal year basis as the program reaches maturity.

Table 2 also shows the estimated amounts of financial assistance for the 381 accepted offers from inception to March 31, 1984, by tier and program element. The total amount of assistance is estimated at \$82.6 million with Tier I representing approximately 47 per cent of this total. The share of projects in Tier II and Tier III in total estimated assistance was 29 per cent and 16 per cent, respectively. Tier IV projects accounted for \$6.7 million or roughly 8 per cent of total estimated financial assistance. In terms of program elements, Modernization/Expansion projects represented approximately 39 per cent of total estimated assistance under the IRDP during the period under review, followed by Industrial Development Climate

projects (22 per cent), Innovation projects at 19 per cent and projects to establish new facilities at 15 per cent.

Table 3 provides another perspective of offers accepted under the IRDP from program inception to March 31, 1984. It shows the distribution of offers by size of estimated amount of financial assistance. The largest number of offers (329) or approximately 86 per cent of the total, resulted in an average Crown contribution of less than \$250 000. About 7 per cent of all offers led to contributions between \$250 000 and \$500 000 and less than 3 per cent are between \$500 000 and \$1 million. Offers resulting in a contribution of over one million dollars accounted for approximately 4 per cent of total offers.

Table 4 gives both the number of offers accepted and the estimated amount of financial assistance under the IRDP from inception to March 31, 1984, broken down by major industry groups eligible under the program (two-digit SIC Code). This table reveals that approximately 19 per cent of total estimated financial assistance under the IRDP was awarded to projects in the machinery industry, followed by the paper products at 10 per cent.

Table 5 provides estimates of jobs to be created and maintained through projects associated with offers accepted under the IRDP during the period under consideration. Total jobs were estimated at 8 688. Table 5 also gives a breakdown of this total by program element. It may be seen from this distribution that Modernization/Expansion projects accounted for a large portion of these jobs with approximately 60 per cent of the total, followed by new facility projects at 22 per cent and Innovation projects at 12 per cent.

The average amount of Crown contribution per job created or maintained (cost per job) under the IRDP is calculated at \$9 505. This estimate is based on the amount of total assistance awarded under the program from inception to March 31, 1984, and the total jobs created and maintained during the same period as provided in Table 5.

Also shown in Table 5 are total eligible costs of projects covered by the 381 accepted offers during the period under review. These amounted to \$374.9 million. The table provides a breakdown of this total figure by program element and reveals that Modernization/Expansion projects

accounted for a large proportion (44 per cent) of these eligible costs. New facility or Establishment projects claimed another 13 per cent of this total, while the share of Industrial Development Climate projects was 6 per cent.

The leverage of private investment under the IRDP during the period under review is estimated at 4.5:1. This ratio is obtained by dividing total costs of projects associated with the 381 accepted offers by the total amount of estimated assistance (Crown contribution) as provided in Table 5.

Finally, Table 6 presents a list of all IRDP accepted offers from inception to March 31, 1984.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

This section identifies terms used in the report and provides a brief explanatory comment for each. These explanations are designed to facilitate understanding; they do not necessarily provide complete legal or administrative definitions nor do they depict all benefits, conditions, restraints or requirements that exist under the program. For specific purposes, reference should be made to the Industrial and Regional Development Act, the Regulations made under that Act, and other sources of official information.

1. Contribution: A contribution that is non-repayable, partially repayable, specifically repayable or one that is conditionally repayable under terms and conditions specified in the offer and accepted by the applicant.
2. Participation Loan: A loan for the establishment of a new facility or for the restructuring of a commercial operation which, by its terms, allows the Minister to participate in the success by means of a stock option, a royalty on sales or production or otherwise; the rate of interest for a participation loan is equivalent to the lowest rate of interest charged by the Federal Business Development Bank on its term loans.
3. Grant: Assistance given to an applicant for a study, scholarship or course development relating to industrial development.
4. Application: A written submission by an applicant requesting assistance under the Industrial and Regional Development Act.
 - (a) Received: An application delivered to the Department. The date of receipt is used for reporting and for establishing whether any prior commitment has occurred in respect of a cost of a proposed project or activity.
 - (b) Withdrawn: An application revoked by the applicant before or during evaluation.
 - (c) Rejected: An application for a project which is considered ineligible under the legislation, which would proceed without assistance, or which would make no significant economic or social contribution to Canada.

An application normally relates to a single project at a single site.

5. Offer Made: When an application has been evaluated and a grant or contribution has been authorized, the estimated amount of the grant or contribution and the related conditions are made known to the applicant in a formal letter of offer.
 - (a) Lapsed: If an applicant does not formally accept an offer within 90 days, the offer lapses.
 - (b) Withdrawn: If the Department becomes aware of certain kinds of information prior to acceptance, it may revoke its offer.
 - (c) Declined: A formal decline of an offer by the applicant.

6. (a) Offer Accepted: Offer acceptance occurs when the applicant returns a signed copy of the offer within 90 days from its date.
 - (b) Offer withdrawn (after acceptance): If the Department determines that legal requirements have not been met, it takes action to withdraw the offer, or if an applicant revokes his acceptance of an offer.

7. Final Payment Made: A final payment on account of contribution is made when the Department is satisfied that all the conditions specified in the accepted offer have been met. The final payment for an establishment, expansion or modernization project cannot be made until 24 months after the certified date of commercial production. For all other projects, the final payment is made on completion of the project.

8. Project Location: The location of the project based on information provided by the applicant.

9. SIC Code: The Standard Industrial Classification System 1980 established by Statistics Canada for standardizing definitions and techniques in the gathering and compilation of statistics related to industries in Canada.

10. Program Elements:
 - (a) Climate: Projects under the Industrial Development Climate element of IRDP for the establishment of a non-profit center or institute relating to industrial development, for an economic development study, for specialized services, for infrastructure development or for course development or scholarships.

- (b) Innovation: Projects for the development of a new or improved product or production process, for the design of new, mass-producible durable products, for the improvement or expansion of technological capability, or for research and development in the area of pollution abatement technology.
 - (c) New facility: Establishment of a new facility to manufacture goods, or provide services (tourism).
 - (d) Modernization: A change or addition made to an existing facility that is primarily designed to reduce production costs, improve product quality, and which can include replacements of existing fixed assets, with or without the use of microelectronic devices.
 - (e) Expansion: An addition to an existing facility to increase the output of the commodity or service on the same site, or a relocation of a facility.
 - (f) Marketing: Projects for collecting and disseminating information, arranging a special event or conference to develop and increase the market of tourism operations, or to increase the marketing of the products or services of these operations; also for literature, advertising, trade shows, seminars, market research and analysis, and promotion of Canadian standards and product specifications to increase the marketing of the products or services of commercial operations.
 - (g) Restructuring: A change with respect to the products, methods of production, services, markets or management procedures of a commercial operation that is in need of renewal.
11. Estimated Eligible Cost: The costs of a development climate, innovation, establishment, expansion, modernization, marketing or restructuring project, as estimated by the Department on the basis of information supplied by an applicant, covering only costs that are eligible for a grant, contribution, or participation loan.
12. Estimated Amount of Assistance: The departmental estimate of the grant, contribution or participation loan to be paid, based on an evaluation of the proposed project.
