ANNUAL REPORT

APRIL 1, 1988, TO MARCH 31, 1989

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A. INTRODUCTION

The Minister of Regional Industrial Expansion is required, under Section 15 of the Industrial and Regional Development Act, to report to Parliament by the first day of June following each fiscal year on the administration of the Act. Under the provisions of the Act, the final date to submit applications for financial support under the Industrial and Regional Development Program (IRDP) was June 30, 1988. This sixth annual report includes a brief explanation of the IRDP and an analysis of the program's operations for the period from April 1, 1988, to March 31, 1989.

An explanation of the terms used in administering the Act appears on page 5 of this report.

The IRDP was implemented in July 1983. The objective of the program was to promote regional and industrial development by assisting private sector initiatives aimed at improving economic return, sustained growth and international competitiveness. Assistance was provided to business through contributions and repayable contributions.

Two types of applicants were eligible for support:

- Commercial operations, consisting of manufacturing or processing operations, could apply under the Innovation, Establishment and Modernization/Expansion elements.
- Eligible persons, essentially non-profit organizations carrying on activities in support of commercial operations, could apply under the Innovation and Marketing elements.

Although the program was national in scope, financial assistance was available in all regions of Canada based on four tier groups into which census divisions were classified:

- Tier I consisted of the most developed census divisions of the country where approximately 50 percent of the population lived.
- Tier II comprised census divisions that were next in line on the development scale and accounted for approximately 30 percent of the population.
- Tier III covered the relatively less developed areas and accounted for approximately 15 percent of the population.
- Tier IV included the least developed areas in which no more than 5 percent of the population resided.

Financial assistance under the IRDP is scaled in proportion to the tier group level in which the eligible project is located, i.e., the higher the tier level, the greater the maximum possible assistance. Tier group designations were made according to a "development index", which was a measure of economic disparity in the country based on income, unemployment and provincial fiscal capacity indicators in 260 of Canada's census divisions as provided by Statistics Canada.

To address possible short-term economic downturns in a Tier I census district, the program provided for the equivalent of Tier II assistance for the Establishment and Modernization/Expansion elements when the average ratio of unemployment insurance beneficiaries to working-age population in the census district exceeded, by one percentage point, the national average for any consecutive six months. Applications were accepted for one year following designation of an area as Special Tier I.

Since June 5, 1987, the responsibility for administering and delivering all IRDP projects with eligible costs of \$20 million or less in the Atlantic provinces has been transferred to the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency (ACOA). For the Western provinces, this responsibility has been transferred to the Department of Western Economic Diversification (WD) since August 4, 1987.

It should be noted that applications for financial assistance and supporting documentation received under the IRDP and other departmental programs contain information that must be regarded as commercially confidential. For this reason and as a matter of policy, the department does not make public certain types of data. For similar reasons of commercial confidentiality, the department does not reveal that a particular application has been received unless and until it results in an accepted offer of financial assistance.

## B. RESULTS

During the 1988/89 fiscal year, 796 applications were received bringing the number from inception to June 30, 1988, to a total of 13,921.

Statistics on IRDP activities for each tier, from July 1, 1983, to March 31, 1989, are presented in Table 1. The data are based on all applications received since inception and reflect their disposition at March 31, 1989. The cumulative total of applications includes 27 cases received under the Regional Development Incentives Act (RDIA) and transferred to the IRDP in accordance with section 13 of the Industrial and Regional Development Act. A breakdown of applications received in 1988/89, by tier, is presented in Table 2.

Tables 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 present more detailed information on offers accepted for the current year and on a cumulative basis. Tables 8, 9 and 10 present additional data for the current year only. These tables are discussed below.

Table 2 shows the number of applications received in 1988/89 in each tier. It can be seen that Tier II had the highest proportion of applications received - 348, or 44 percent of the total, followed closely by Tier III with 317 applications or 40 percent.

Table 3 shows offers accepted during the current fiscal year and the cumulative acceptances since inception of the program. The 328 offers accepted in 1988/89 have an IRDP contribution of \$196 million. This brings up the total number of accepted offers to 4524 and the total amount of cumulative contribution to \$1.5 billion since inception of the program. It should be noted that the 4524 accepted offers represent 93 percent of the 4880 offers made since the inception of the IRDP.

Tables 3, 4, 6 and 7 provide a breakdown of these accepted offers by tier grouping, program element, amount of assistance and major industry groups respectively. Table 5 shows the accepted offers equal to, or over \$5 million by planning element and tier. A detailed listing of each of the 328 offers accepted in 1988/89 appears in Table 10. Please note that these tables include only accepted offers for which the funding was authorized by DRIE.



From Table 3, it can be seen that the largest proportion of offers accepted were in Tier II, 146 or 45 percent, followed by those accepted in Tier III, 130 or 40 percent, and in Tier I, 41 or 13 percent. However, the corresponding authorized assistance shows that Tier III had the largest proportion of total assistance, with \$85 million or 43 percent. Tiers II, IV and I followed with \$55 million, \$34 million and \$21.6 million respectively. Overall, the dollar value of offers accepted in Tiers III and IV has increased from \$77.6 million, \$21.4 million respectively in 1987/88 to \$85 million and \$34 million respectively in 1988/89.

As can be seen in Table 4, the Modernization/Expansion program element, with 167 accepted offers, represented approximately 51 percent of total IRDP assistance for 1988/89. The Establishment of new facility was a distant second with 72 offers accounting for only 22 percent of the total. Some 63 (or 19 percent of total offers) were accepted in the Innovation element; however the total value of offers accepted in the Innovation element was the highest with \$70 million or 36 percent.

Table 6 provides a breakdown of offers accepted by different amounts of assistance. It can be seen that 137 offers accepted or 42 percent of all offers were for less than \$100 000 in Crown contribution. However, these amount to only 4 percent of the total dollar value of authorized assistance under IRDP in 1988/89. Even though there were only 28 offers with assistance greater than \$1 million, the proportion in terms of dollar value of these large offers was more than 67 percent of total assistance. Table 5 shows that there were seven accepted offers over \$5 million each, totalling \$83 million in authorized assistance. This corresponds to 42 percent of total IRDP assistance for 1988/89.

Table 7 gives both the number of accepted offers and the authorized assistance for each major industry group eligible under the program. This table reveals that the machinery industry, which had the highest number of offers accepted (51 or 16 percent), accounted for 9 percent of total assistance. The paper-allied industry had the highest proportion of financial assistance (\$41 million or 21 percent) with only five offers or 1.5 percent of the number of accepted offers.

The "other" category, which accounted for 3 percent of the total IRDP authorized assistance, consists of sectors such as university education, computer services and business associations.

### 3. Benefits

One of the general IRDP program criteria stipulated that the project and exploitation of the results must represent significant economic benefits to Canada. Two of the main indicators of economic benefits in IRDP were the number of jobs created and/or maintained as a result of the authorized assistance and the leverage of private investment which measured the investment of the private sector in the projects that were supported for each dollar contributed by the federal government.

Table 8 provides a breakdown, by program element and by tier, of the leverage of private investment. This ratio is obtained by dividing the eligible costs of projects by the authorized assistance. Examination of this table reveals that the highest ratio, 5.9:1, is in the Establishment (of a new facility) Program element and in Tiers II and III at 5.2:1. The lowest leverage is for the projects in Tier IV at 2:1.

This means that for each dollar contributed by the federal government, the private sector has invested approximately \$5.20 in Tiers II and III and \$5.90 in Establishment-related projects as opposed to only \$2.00 in Tier IV areas. The average leverage of private investment taken across all tiers and program elements in 1988/89 is \$4.50.

The jobs to be created and maintained for each tier and program element are provided in Table 9. The average cost per job across the program elements and Tiers was estimated at \$16 066.

#### EXPLANATION OF TERMS

This section identifies terms used in the report and provides a brief explanatory comment for each. These explanations are designed to facilitate understanding; they do not necessarily provide complete legal or administrative definitions nor do they depict all benefits, conditions, restraints or requirements that exist under the program. For specific purposes, reference should be made to the Industrial and Regional Development Act, the regulations made under that Act, and other sources of official information.

1. Contribution: A contribution that is non-repayable, partially repayable, specifically repayable or one that is conditionally repayable under terms and conditions specified in the offer and accepted by the applicant.
2. Participation Loan: A loan for the establishment of a new facility or for the restructuring of a commercial operation which, by its terms, allows the minister to participate in the success by means of a stock option, a royalty on sales or production or otherwise; the rate of interest for a participation loan is equivalent to the lowest rate of interest charged by the Federal Business Development Bank on its term loans.
3. Grant: Assistance given to an applicant for a study, scholarship or course development relating to industrial development.
4. Application: A written submission by an applicant requesting assistance under the Industrial and Regional Development Act.
  - (a) Received: An application delivered to the department. The date of receipt is used for reporting and for establishing whether any prior commitment has occurred in respect of a cost of a proposed project or activity.
  - (b) Withdrawn: An application revoked by the applicant before or during evaluation.

- (c) Rejected: An application for a project considered ineligible under the legislation, which would proceed without assistance, or which would make no significant economic or social contribution to Canada.

An application normally relates to a single project at a single site.

- 5. Offer Made: When an application has been evaluated and a grant or contribution authorized, the estimated amount of the grant or contribution and the related conditions are made known to the applicant in a formal letter of offer.
  - (a) Lapsed: If an applicant does not formally accept an offer within 90 days, the offer lapses.
  - (b) Withdrawn: If the department becomes aware of certain kinds of information prior to acceptance, it may revoke its offer.
  - (c) Declined: A formal decline of an offer by the applicant.
- 6. (a) Offer Accepted: Offer acceptance occurs when the applicant returns a signed copy of the offer within 90 days from its date.
  - (b) Offer withdrawn (after acceptance): If the department determines that legal requirements have not been met, it takes action to withdraw the offer, or if an applicant revokes his or her acceptance of an offer.
- 7. Final Payment Made: A final payment on account of contribution is made when the department is satisfied that all the conditions specified in the accepted offer have been met. The final payment for an establishment, expansion or modernization project cannot be made until 24 months after the certified date of commercial production. For all other projects, the final payment is made on completion of the project.
- 8. Project Location: The location of the project based on information provided by the applicant.
- 9. SIC Code: The Standard Industrial Classification System 1980 established by Statistics Canada for standardizing definitions and techniques in the gathering and compilation of statistics related to industries in Canada.
- 10. Program Elements:
  - (a) Climate: Projects under the Industrial Development Climate element of IRDP for the establishment of a non-profit centre or institute relating to industrial development, for an economic development study, for specialized services, for infrastructure development or for course development or scholarships.
  - (b) Innovation: Projects for the development of a new or improved product or production process, for the design of new, mass-producible durable

products, for the improvement or expansion of technological capability, or for research and development in the area of pollution abatement technology.

- (c) New facility: Establishment of a new facility to manufacture goods, or provide services (tourism).
  - (d) Modernization: A change or addition made to an existing facility primarily designed to reduce production costs, improve product quality, and which can include replacements of existing fixed assets, with or without the use of microelectronic devices.
  - (e) Expansion: An addition to an existing facility to increase the output of the commodity or service on the same site, or a relocation of a facility.
  - (f) Marketing: Projects for collecting and disseminating information, arranging a special event or conference to develop and increase the market of tourism operations, or to increase the marketing of the products or services of these operations; also for literature, advertising, trade shows, seminars, market research and analysis, and promotion of Canadian standards and product specifications to increase the marketing of the products or services of commercial operations.
  - (g) Restructuring: A change with respect to the products, methods of production, services, markets or management procedures of a commercial operation that is in need of renewal.
11. Estimated Eligible Cost: The costs of a development climate, innovation, establishment, expansion, modernization, marketing or restructuring project, as estimated by the department on the basis of information supplied by an applicant, covering only costs that are eligible for a grant, contribution or participation loan.
12. Authorized Amount of Assistance: The departmental grant, contribution or participation loan to be paid, based on the terms of the accepted contract.
