
INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to provide Canadian companies interested in supplying products and/or services to the information technology (IT) industry with a guide to sources of federal and provincial government assistance to help them become more internationally competitive. The IT sector is facing increasing global competitive pressures and our economy is becoming increasingly knowledge-based. The need for Canadian IT suppliers to be internationally competitive has never been greater.

This document is <u>solutions-driven</u> and is not simply an alphabetical listing of government assistance programs. The starting point is a listing of what we understand to be the most frequently encountered manufacturing and management-related deficiencies of Canadian manufacturers/suppliers. Assigned to each deficiency are government assistance programs, both federal and provincial, which may offer assistance in overcoming the deficiency. The programs include those which are relevant to any Canadian firm irrespective of geographic location, and those which are geographically specific. The user of this compendium has only to identify with a deficiency or group of deficiencies, look up the referenced program, and the relevant details of the applicable program(s) are provided.

It should also be noted that some deficiencies, such as price competitiveness, may be extensions of other deficiencies and are therefore not specifically listed to avoid unnecessary repetition.

The program descriptions are intended to be brief and concise. Additional information which may assist in determining a firm's eligibility can be obtained by telephoning or faxing the responsibility centre associated with each program. These contacts are current as of February 1993. It should be emphasized that many of these programs have varying degrees of direct applicability with respect to supplier development. As well, some programs provide considerable financial support while others provide assistance of a more diagnostic/advice orientation.

HOW TO USE THIS COMPENDIUM

This document has been developed through a consultative process with industry and government representatives. It is intended to be "solutions-oriented", addressing specific deficiencies which suppliers are experiencing in their efforts to become more internationally competitive. Instead of providing an alphabetical listing of programs, this compendium lists commonly experienced supplier deficiencies and then matches these deficiencies to federal and provincial assistance programs which are thought to provide support to correct these deficiencies.

This compendium consists of four parts. Part 1 is a summary matrix which sets out all the programs covered by this directory, their program number in the compendium, the page number, the specific deficiencies addressed by the program and the telephone number of the administering responsibility centre. Part 2 is a description of each of the fourteen most commonly experienced Canadian supplier deficiencies, organized by geographic location, which delineates the type of assistance provided by each applicable program and the page number of the actual program(s) in the compendium. Part 3 is a listing of federal and provincial government programs which provides details of the programs and a contact person. Part 4 is an alphabetical listing of the programs contained in this directory.

To use this directory, the supplier must associate his specific deficiency with one of the more generic deficiencies described in Part 2. The programs in Part 3 which are believed to address the deficiency are cross-referenced in Part 2. The user has only to turn to the more detailed description of the program in Part 3 to obtain information on the program; purpose or objective, eligibility, nature and amount of assistance, terms and conditions, and a contact for further information.

The program descriptions are necessarily short and concise. Further information may be obtained from the program contact provided at the end of the program description.

If the user is aware of a specific program which may assist him, notwithstanding the deficiency to which it is associated in this compendium, a complete alphabetical listing of the programs contained in this compendium for federal programs and provincial programs with page numbers, is provided at the end of this document.

TIP funding is based on cost-sharing principles and covers costs associated with international travel and living expenses. Support for specific TIP projects will not normally exceed \$10,000.

Purpose or Objective

To encourage more employers, particularly in key adjustment situations, to assume primary responsibility for meeting changing skill needs in their workplace, through the negotiation of partnership agreements to adopt Human Resource Planning, Workplace Based Training and other adjustment measures.

Eligibility

All businesses, organizations, sectoral or industrial associations.

Nature and Amount of Assistance

The Labour Market Adjustment Program (LMAP) has a number of key components. The Local Human Resource Planning module provides financial assistance to coordinators to provide technical assistance to employers in order to acquire Human Resource Planning (HRP) expertise. The Sectoral/National Human Resource Planning module provides financial assistance towards the implementation of HRP driven initiatives. The Workplace Based Training component provides contributions towards the training costs of employers, including a percentage of the wages, as well as leasing/purchasing of equipment and up to \$10,000 for special equipment for the disabled trainees. The Work Sharing component provides Unemployment Insurance benefits to workers who have accepted a shared temporary reduction of normal working hours to avoid lay-offs. The Training Trust Fund encourages the establishment of new training trust funds, or strengthening of existing funds. To foster the development of entrepreneurship, increase the rate of new business formation and improve the competitiveness of small- and medium-sized businesses.

Eligibility

Sectors:

Strategic Initiatives, that is, projects, activities or initiatives which, in the opinion of the Minister, represent a strategic investment for the economic development of the Atlantic Region, could also be eligible.

Nature and Amount of Assistance

Types of Assistance

• Innovation Assistance

ACOA may contribute up to 75% of the eligible costs of projects to advance the level of technology in use in the region, improve productivity or develop new or improved products.

Capital Investment Assistance

Contribution - For projects up to \$200,000 in eligible capital costs, depending on evaluation of viability and economic benefit, up to 50% of capital costs may be available for new facility establishment. This does not include mergers, acquisitions or refinancing. Up to 40% of capital costs may be available for expansion or modernization of existing facilities, including replacement or relocation.

For projects between \$200,000 and \$10 million in eligible capital costs, depending on evaluation of viability and economic benefit, the lesser of up to 25% of capital costs or \$500,000 in contributions may be available for the above.

Loan Insurance - When an entrepreneur cannot get adequate funding from a financial institution for his/her project with eligible costs up to \$20 million, the ACOA Action Program may provide 85% loan insurance for new capital investments to help him/her get started or grow. Loan insurance is not available for mergers, acquisitions or refinancing.

Interest Buy-Down - The ACOA Action Program may reduce the interest rate on new business term loans (normally for a maximum of seven years) by as much as six percentage points.

• Business Studies

The ACOA Action Program may assist in the costs of engaging qualified consultants involved in investigating ideas and in improving the quality of management. Studies that seek to improve the viability of an operation, establish a marketing plan or support an Innovation project may receive up to 75% of eligible costs. Business plan/feasibility studies in support of establishment, modernization or expansion projects may receive up to 50% of eligible costs.

• Business Support

Assistance may be provided for the lesser of up to 50% of the eligible costs or \$500,000 in contribution for non-commercial projects that provide a service to small- and mediumsized businesses, such as training and technology transfer. Projects are limited to \$10 million in eligible costs.

• Marketing Development

This element is designed to respond to the marketing needs of small- and medium-sized businesses and to help them take advantage of evolving trade opportunities. The contribution for hiring qualified persons to implement a marketing plan consists of contribution on salaries of up to 75% in year one, 50% in year two and 25% in year three. Contributions up to 50% are available for direct costs of developing new packaging, promotional material, advertising, product or equipment demonstrations and participation at trade shows.

• Supplier Development Fund

Contributions up to 75% for bid preparation (except for contracts fully under the scope of the GATT and FTA procurement provisions), and 50% for other costs related to enhancing the ability of a commercial operation to bid for or acquire public procurement contracts. There is a maximum contribution of \$250,000.

• Human Resources Development (HRD)

Financial assistance is available to develop a Human Resources Development Plan (to a maximum of \$10,000), and to develop and deliver a training package based on the needs identified in the Plan.

To this end, the following activities and costs are eligible:

- up to 75% during the first year and 50% during the second year for the costs of undertaking a qualified person(s) for the HRD plan development, and/or development and implementation of an acceptable and approved training package.
- up to 75% of direct incremental costs for developing and implementing the training package; eligible costs include those associated with developing, purchasing, or renting training materials and with delivering the training, such as seminar fees and a limited contribution towards wages for off-site training.
- the total contribution will not exceed \$150,000 per applicant per two year period.

Action Loan

The Action Loan is business financing in the form of an unsecured term loan up to a maximum of \$1 million. As with any loan, it has to be repaid. The maximum repayment period can be over ten years and features an interest-free period of up to five years for business start-ups and up to three years for an existing enterprise. Common Acronym

Purpose or Objective

To provide business participants an opportunity to have their businesses analyzed, improvements recommended and actual results seen.

Eligibility

Small businesses located in Alberta.

Nature and Amount of Assistance

The program provides for one-on-one confidential consulting, and if necessary group consulting, by private sector, professional management consultants. The goal is to help businesses improve profits and solve their problems at a reasonable cost. The fees charged are paid to the sponsoring Chamber or business organization to cover their share of the program costs.

The typical program begins with the Chamber or business organization agreeing to sponsor the program for its members. Registrants are usually limited to 20 in number. The organizers will request a MAP program from the Department, in writing, along with a definition of the Terms of Reference required for the group. Consultants are contracted through a bid process organized by Economic Development and Trade and an appropriate consulting firm chosen. By this time, the organizers must have a least a minimum number of participants signed up.

Registration fees for the participants will be up to 25% of the total consultants' costs with a maximum per business of \$250.00.

The organizers will then arrange a kick-off meeting for all participants at which the consultants will explain how the program will work, arrange individual meeting schedules and hand out a brief questionnaire.

Phase I - Research Phase

The consultants meet with each participating business at their place of business for a half-day to identify areas where improvements may be made. Primarily, the purpose of this session is for the consultants to familiarize themselves with the business.

Phase II - Counselling

Within two - three weeks after the first phase, each business is revisited and all problems previously identified are discussed and recommendations made. The recommendations are very specific to each business and may come from the financial, marketing, operational or any combination of these areas.

Phase III - Audit

After a period of approximately 3 - 5 months, the consultants return to each business for a final visit to conduct a program review and to determine the effectiveness of the implementation of the recommendations. Additional recommendations for the long term may be made at this time.

At the end of this phase, the group will again meet to have the consultants describe the overall results of the program.

Terms & Conditions

The foregoing is the outline for an average M.A.P. organization. Variations from this outline are permissible depending on the Terms of Reference provided by the organizing body. For example, a program relating specifically to the retail sector may include a retail workshop for all participants plus the regular program phases.

The responsibility for the implementation of the consultants' recommendations lies solely with the participating business.

The sponsoring organization is directly responsible for its share of the overall Consultants' costs.

Export Loan Guarantee Program (B.C. Trade Development Corporation)

Common Acronym

Purpose or Objective

The Export Loan Guarantee Program provides an opportunity for British Columbia Business* to benefit from loan guarantees for the working capital needed in export development.

Eligibility

Any registered British Columbia Business is eligible, providing it manufactures or processes products or provides services with a high British Columbia content for export outside the province.

Export consortiums and trading companies are eligible if they purchase or take title to finished goods manufactured or processed in British columbia for export.

Companies do not have to hold back until an export sale is signed. B.C. Trade will also consider pre-approving financing of specific orders or contracts while the B.C. company is still negotiating with potential export customers.

* Includes Limited Companies, Federally chartered Companies, Partnerships, Sole Proprietorships.

Nature and Amount of Assistance

The British Columbia Trade Development Corporation may guarantee up to 85% of a loan to a maximum of \$2.5 million per company. The loans can cover up to 100% of the eligible costs, or up to 85% of sale proceeds of an order or contract.

Interest rates are negotiated in the normal way by the borrower and the lender.

Loan terms of up to three years may be guaranteed.

Terms & Conditions

Periodic payments of principal and interest will be made to the lending institution as monies are received from the purchaser, or from the proceeds of any claim for insurance or other financial instruments relating to the project.

B.C. Trade will charge a fee in consideration for providing the loan guarantee; the amount of the fee will vary with the risk of the project and the financial strength of the borrower, but will not be less than 3% of the amount of the guarantee per 12 month period or any portion thereof. A non-refundable administration fee of \$350.00 is to be submitted with all Export Loan Guarantee applications. All legal fees, accounting or other consulting fees associated with the Loan Guarantee will be paid for by the applicant.

As a minimum, the lender will take specific security such as an assignment of proceeds under the contract or order being financed and will include, but will not be limited to:

- the insurance of the assets held as security
- charges on any inventories
- payment guarantees; and
- any other supporting security dictated by prudent lending practices

Claims under the guarantee provisions are restricted to 35% of the net loss incurred after deducting from the loan balance the value of security held in support of the loan. Net loss includes disbursements for protection of the assets, costs of collection, loan principal and accrued interest.
