2017-2018 ANNUAL REPORT ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT



1. INTRODUCTION

The Access to Information Act (the "Act") gives Canadian citizens as well as individuals and corporations present in Canada the right to access records under the control of federal government institutions, subject to limited and specific exceptions. The Act is intended to complement existing procedures for access to government information and not to limit in any way information that is normally available to the public.

Section 72 of the Act requires the head of every federal government institution to submit a report to Parliament on the administration of the Act at their institution each fiscal year.

This report was prepared pursuant to section 72 of the Act and describes how the National Film Board of Canada (the "NFB") administered the Act in fiscal year 2017–2018.

The NFB's mandate is to produce and distribute distinctive, culturally diverse, challenging and relevant audiovisual works that provide Canada and the world with a unique Canadian perspective.

2. LAW APPLICATION

In accordance with section 73 of the Act, the Minister of Canadian Heritage appoints the following individuals to administer the Access to Information Act.

- > The Government Film Commissioner:
- > The Director General, Institutional, Legal and Human Resources Services:
- > The Access to Information Coordinator;
- > The Legal Counsel.

The NFB has no official entity tasked with processing access to information requests. The requests are forwarded to the Access to Information Coordinator, who is part of the Business Affairs and Legal Services department.

The Access to Information Coordinator is also responsible for coordination pursuant to the *Privacy Act*.

A copy of the 2017–2018 Statistical Report is attached as Appendix B.

Requests submitted pursuant to the Access to Information Act

The NFB received 12 access to information requests between April 1, 2017, and March 31, 2018, compared with 19 requests received in 2016–2017.

In comparison with the last fiscal year, the total number of requests received has decreased.

Types of requests

Below are the different requests received, broken down by the sector from which they originated.

- 4 requests from university institutions (33.33%);
- > 8 requests from members of the public (66.367%).

As in previous years, the NFB observed that the applicants who sent their requests preferred to receive copies of governmental documentation rather than just being permitted to examine the documentation.

Fully processed requests

The NFB fully processed 13 requests during the 2017–2018 reporting period, including one that was carried forward from the previous year. None of the requests received in 2017–2018 have been carried forward to the next fiscal year.

The NFB processed these requests as follows:

- 4 fully disclosed communications (30.77%);
- 9 partial communications (69.23%);

Turnaround time and postponements

The NFB processed these 13 requests during the 2017–2018 reporting period, within the following timeframes:

- 2 requests processed within not more than 15 days (15.38%);
- > 7 requests processed within not more than 30 days (53.85%); and
- 4 requests processed within 31 to 60 days (30.77%).

Exemptions and exclusions

The NFB invoked exemptions under the Act 22 times in total, as follows:

- 2 times under paragraph 18 (b);
- > 1 time under paragraph 18 (d);
- > 9 times under paragraph 19 (1);
- > 5 times under paragraph 20 (1)c);
- > 1 time under paragraph 21(1)a);
- > 1 time under paragraph 21(1)b);
- 2 times under paragraph 21(1)d); and
- > 1 time under section 23.

Consultations

In 2017–2018, the NFB processed a total of 14 consultation requests. All requests originated from other Government of Canada institutions. The requests were processed within the following timeframes:

- → 6 requests processed within not more than 15 days (42.86%);
- ▶ 4 requests processed within not more than 30 days (28.57%); and
- 4 requests processed within 31 to 60 days (28.57%).

Multi-year trend

During the three years preceding the reporting period, the number of requests received annually by the NFB ranged from 15 to 22. The largest number of these requests came from the university sector. The exceptions most often invoked in these requests are exceptions under paragraphs 19(1), 20(1)c) and section 23. During this period, only one exclusion was invoked.

5. EDUCATION AND TRAINING

No formal education or training activities were held during the reporting period.

6. NEW POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

In this reporting period, no new organizational policies or procedures relating to the administration of the Act were implemented at the NFB.

7. COMPLAINTS AND INVESTIGATIONS

The NFB received two notices of inquiry under section 32 of the Act, issued by the Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada following two complaints against the NFB. The processing of one of these complaints was completed in the 2017–2018 fiscal year. The NFB offered its full cooperation to the Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada during the investigation and complied with the findings of the investigator. The second complaint review by the Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada is ongoing.

8. MONITORING OF THE TIME TO PROCESS REQUESTS

No monitoring of the amount of time taken to process access to information requests was conducted during the reporting period.
