

Natural Resources Canada's ENERGY STAR® Challenge for Industry is a tool that helps energy managers and industrial facilities improve energy performance.

Participate by pledging to reduce energy intensity by 10 percent within 5 years.



Participating helps facilities:

- Create momentum for energy initiatives by setting an improvement goal;
- Establish energy management practices for tracking and benchmarking energy performance;
- Raise awareness and engage employees by leveraging the ENERGY STAR brand – the most recognized name in energy efficiency;
- Increase the energy team and program's visibility to senior and executive managers; and
- Improve energy efficiency, reduce energy costs, increase profitability.



Participating is easy:

- 1. Select an energy intensity metric.
- 2. Pick an energy use tracking method or system.
- 3. Set a baseline and 10 percent improvement goal.
- 4. Create a file and basic plan for managing data.
- 5. Register for the Challenge.
- 6. Track energy use and pursue energy saving opportunities.
- 7. Verify energy savings and apply for recognition.
