Over **1.3 million** or 5% of Canadians aged 15 years and over have a hearing disability.

35% of Canadians with a hearing disability also have a seeing disability.



319,000 Canadians with

a hearing disability do not use a hearing aid or cochlear implant but need them. Of these, 66% say it is because of cost.
