## Being married or common-law in Canado

## In 2017, more than 7 in 10 adults in Canada ${ }^{1}$ aged 25 to 64 were married or common-Law.

## Married

- 11 million people
- $5.6 \%$ of adults aged 25 to 64
- 18 years on average

Average age at start of current marriage:

## Common-law

- 3 million people
- $15 \%$ of adults aged 25 to 64

10 years on average

Nearly 4 in 10 had cohabited with their spouse before marriage.


Being married was more common among the foreign born.

Living common-law was less tikely among the foreign born.


People in Quebec were by far the most likely to be living common-law.
