
Canadians with a Seeing Disability




1.5 million or 5.4% of Canadians

Canadians with a seeing disability by sex and age groups:

Of those with a seeing disability, **84%** use **one or more** aids or assistive devices.



Top three aids and assistive devices used:

Eye glasses or contact lenses



Magnifiers



Large print reading materials



Of those who require vision related aids or assistive devices,

85%
have all their needs met.

Note: The Canadian Survey on Disability covers Canadians aged 15 years and over who experience limitations in their daily activities because of a long-term condition or health-related problem.

43 is the average age when a person with a seeing disability begins to feel limited in their daily activities.
