Employment holds steady for the second consecutive month

In June, employment held steady for the second consecutive month. The unemployment rate rose 0.1 percentage points to 5.5% as the number of people looking for work increased. In the second quarter, employment rose by 132,000 (+0.7%), virtually all in full-time work.

The rate of violent crime against young women and girls higher in the North than in the South

While young women and girls in the North accounted for less than 7% of Canada's female population aged 24 and younger in 2017, they represented 17% of young female victims of police-reported violent

crime. The rate of violent crime against young women and girls living in the North was nearly three times higher than it was in the South.

Over one-third of young people aged 20 to 24 without a high school diploma are not in employment, education or training

Young Canadians without a high school diploma have been overrepresented among those not in employment, education or training (NEET) for the past two decades. In 2018/2019, 60,600 youth, or 37% of youth aged 20 to 24 who did not have their high school diploma, were in NEET.

Canada posts trade surplus in May

Canada's merchandise trade balance with the world was in a surplus position in May (\$762 million) for the second time since December 2016. Exports rose 4.6% in May, while imports were up 1.0%.
