E-commerce sales rise by one-quarter over the past year

E-commerce retail sales have increased by one-quarter over the past year on a seasonally unadjusted basis to \$1.8 billion in August,

accounting for 3.2% of total retail sales. By way of comparison, seasonally unadjusted total retail sales rose 1.5% over the same period.

Inventories reach their highest level since 1995

Following 11 consecutive monthly gains, wholesale inventories declined 0.3% to \$93.4 billion in August. However, the inventory-to-sales ratio increased from 1.44 in July to 1.45, the highest level since 1995, as the sales decline in August outpaced the drawdown in inventories.

US travel to Canada reaches its highest level in over a decade in August

There were 2.1 million trips by US residents to Canada in August, down 0.4% from July but the highest level of trips for the month of August since 2007.

Ontario and Alberta lead the increase in single-home construction

The value of single-home construction (+3.2% to \$5.4 billion) exceeded the value of multi-family construction (+0.4% to \$5.3 billion) for the third consecutive month in August, partly due to increased single-home construction in Ontario (+\$94.0 million) and Alberta (+\$47.5 million).
