Please note the total oats shipments both from country elevators and over the loading platform amounted to 37,851,100 bus., and of this quantity only 26,351,100 bus. were inspected; that is to say 11,500,000 bus. were shipped from one district where there was a surplus of oats to another district where there had been a total or partial oat failure—due to drought. Many of the districts in southern Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta had to purchase not only their seed oats but their feed as well.

Owing to drought prevailing, especially in the southern districts of the three Western Provinces, during the growing season of 1910 it was impossible to approximate with any degree of accuracy what the yield per acre would be.

The wheat yield was variously estimated from as high as 120,000,000 bus. during the earlier stages of the season to as low as 75,000,000 and 80,000,000 bus. at harvest time.

The percentage of shipments ex Fort William and Port Arthur terminals to American ports has been steadily increasing during the last four or five years, when they received from us about twenty per cent of the wheat crop and only a nominal percentage of the other kinds of grain. No doubt the Milling-in-bond-in-transit privilege given by the States will account, to a considerable extent, for the increase during the past two years; also the lower freight rates via American ports to American sea-board which prevailed on occasions during the year.

By an Act of the Provincial Government of Manitoba the Manitoba Elevator Commission was created, and they commenced their operations this season by purchasing 174 country elevators throughout the Province; however, in consequence of the drought only 97 of these were operated. For the most part the grain received at the Manitoba Government elevators is handled in special bins in ear lots. That is to say they do a warehousing business pure and simple. To take care of the waggon load lots that are offered for sale on the street they have arranged with certain grain dealers to lease space in each of their elevators to such dealers. These dealers in common with all other elevator operators are required to furnish bonds and take out a license before operating.

The receipts of wheat at the Government elevators for the year amounted to 3,113,236 bushels, and of oats and barley, 1,938,686 bushels; a total of 5,051,922 bushels. The short crop in Manitoba naturally affected the receipts at these elevators the same as at those belonging to other parties. I am confident, however, that they would have handled a very much larger quantity than they did had the crop conditions been different.

Comparatively speaking very few complaints were received at this office on account of scarcity of cars. I am pleased to report that relief at all such points was afforded by the railway companies within twenty-four hours after I had drawn the matter to their notice.

The crop of the North-West for the season was of its usual high quality and character, and the prices received by farmers were highly remunerative.

While naturally in a crop of the magnitude here dealt with, numbers of disputes will of necessity arise between farmers, elevator operators, grain commission merchants, track buyers and also the railway companies, the number of such disputes dealt with by this office during the year were not greater than one would expect under the circumstances; all such, however, were promptly dealt with, and where justified the necessary relief sought was obtained.
