LIVE STOCK SURVEY - JUNE 1, 1942

Hogs - Prairie Provinces

Ottawa, August 12, 1942. The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues today a report on the June survey of live stock and poultry dealing with the numbers of hogs on farms, the 1942 spring pig crop, and numbers of sows to farrow in the fall of 1942, for the Prairie Provinces. This report is based on information obtained from farmers and is prepared in cooperation with the Provincial Departments of Agriculture. Figures for 1941 have been revised from these published a year ago.

SUMMARY

Further expansion in hog numbers in the Prairie Provinces was recorded in the June 1 survey of numbers of swine on farms. The 1942 estimate of 4.1 million head is the highest ever recorded and an increase of approximately one million head from the number on hand at June 1, 1941. Although Alberta is still the leading hog producing province of the Prairies, the percentage increase in numbers was 41 in Manitoba, 40 in Saskatchewan and 23 per cent in Alberta. There was an increase of 28 per cent in numbers of pigs saved during the period December 1941 to May 1942 as compared with the same period a year previously. This increase should be reflected in the marketings of hogs during the fall months of 1942.

An increase of 21.1 per cent is indicated in the numbers of sows bred to farrow during the months June to November, 1942 as compared with the same period of 1941. This increase in fall farrowings will be reflected in the marketings of hogs during the early months of 1943. The promise of a substantial increase in the output of coarse grains in the Prairie Provinces should result in farmers having no difficulty in feeding the expected increase in production.


