LIVE STOCK SURVEY - DECEMBER 1, 1945

Ottawa, March 14, 1946.— The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues today a second bulletin on the December Survey of Live Stock and Poultry dealing with the reports received on cattle and sheep. A detailed statement on hogs was released on February 18, 1946. The estimates are compiled from the card schedules returned by farmers and are prepared in co-operation with the provincial Departments of Agriculture.

CATTLE

Estimates of numbers of cattle on farms at December 1, 1945 showed a decline of nearly 3 per cent from the estimate of numbers for the same date in 1944. Numbers at December 1, 1945 totalled 9,960,800 as compared with 10,257,900 in 1944. Decreases of over 4 per cent occurred in the provinces of New Brunswick, Quebec, Manitoba and Saskatchewan. Numbers of milk cows on farms at December 1, 1945 were only slightly below those of the previous year, the reduction amounting to 1.9 per cent. The decrease in cattle numbers is a result of the very heavy marketings in 1945, particularly in the last half of the year.

SHIMEP

Numbers of sheep on farms at December 1, 1945 at 2,455,800 head are 13 per cent smaller than a year ago. This is the lowest number reported for the December 1 count since 1941. The decrease in sheep numbers was common to all provinces, with New Brunswick, Quebec and the four western provinces indicating the heaviest reductions.
