LIVE STOCK SURVEY - DECEMBER 1, 1946

Ottawa, March 3, 1947 .- The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues today a second bulletin on the December Survey of Live Stock and Poultry dealing with the reports received on cattle, sheep and lambs and horses. A detailed statement on hogs was released on February 14, 1947. The estimates are compiled from the card schedules returned by farmers and are prepared in co-operation with the Provincial Departments of Agriculture.

CATTLE

The down trend in numbers of cattle on farms in Canada, first evident in results of the December 1945 survey, has continued, according to the estimates obtained from the December 1946 survey. Numbers of all cattle on farms in Canada at December 1 are estimated at 9,748,000, a decline of 213,000 from the same date a year ago, or slightly over 2 per cent. Reductions occurred in all provinces except Quebec where numbers at December 1, 1946 are slightly above the corresponding date of 1945. The Greatest decreases are indicated in the Maritime Provinces, Manitoba and Saskatchewan. Numbers of milk cows at 3,959,300 are 53,300 below those of a year ago. The decline in milk cows is common to all provinces except Quebec.

SHEEP

Sheep numbers at December 1, 1946, estimated at 2,186,000, are appreciably below the peak recorded at December 1, 1944 of 2,822,000. The reduction below last year amounts to ll per cent, with the major declines recorded in the Maritimes and the four western provinces.

HORSES

Numbers of horses on farms continue to decline with the December 1, 1946 numbers 7 1/2 per cent below those of a year ago. While decreases are common to all provinces, the greatest are shown for the Frairie Provinces.
