ADVANCE REPORT ON THE FUR FARMS OF ONTARIO, 1940 (a)

The number of fur farms in operation in the province of Ontario in 1940 was 1,408, a reduction of 109 from the preceding year. The number of farms on which foxes are raised totalled 632, while the number of farms reporting mink was 884. The numbers of farms with other kinds of fur bearers are: with fisher, 6; fitch, 2; marten, 4; nutria, 15; raccoon, 36; and with skunk, 1. The total of these numbers does not correspond with the total number of farms, as on some farms more than one kind of fur-bearing animal is raised. It might be noted that the "new type" fox, which term includes platinum, white-face, silver-blue, etc., is reported as raised on 44 farms.

The number of fur-bearing animals born on the farms was slightly less than in 1939 - 103,053 compared with 106,128. The number of silver foxes born shows a reduction of 15 per cent, but mink increased by 3 per cent and nutria by 81 per cent, while the number of new type foxes was 62 compared with none in the preceding year.

The amount of revenue in 1940 was \$1,248,237, to which the sales of pelts contributed \$1,125,476, or 90 per cent, and the sales of live animals, \$122,761, or 10 per cent. In the pelt sales, silver foxes accounted for \$653,015, or 58 per cent of the total value, and mink for \$468,108, or $41\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. In the live animal sales mink was first with \$65,892, or 54 per cent and silver foxes second with \$45,137, or 37 per cent. A large item in the sales of live animals is the new type fox with 28 at \$7,077, or an average value of \$252,75. No pelt sales are recorded for the new type fox.

Retained on the farms at the end of the year 1940 were: silver foxes, 15,731; blue foxes, 387; new type foxes, 128; other kinds of foxes, 189; mink, 33,859; and other kinds of fur-bearing animals, 347. The total value for all kinds, combined, was \$1,567,604. Compared with the preceding year there is a reduction of 2,439, or 13 per cent, in the number of silver foxes, but an increase of 2,367, or 8 per cent, in the number of mink. The number of new type foxes increased from 1 in 1939 to 128 in 1940.
