EXPLANATORY NOTE

Supplement XXXX contains revisions and additions to the farm price series previously published in the confidential report "Farm Prices of Agricultural Products, by Provinces, by months, 1935 to 1946" and Supplements number I to XXXIX thereof. The price series are those which are included in the construction of the Index Numbers of Farm Prices of Agricultural Products published each month by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. Supplement XXXX is divided into Sections A and B. Section A sets forth monthly revisions which have been made for the year 1965-1966 and Section B presents price data not previously published for the months, May to October 1966.

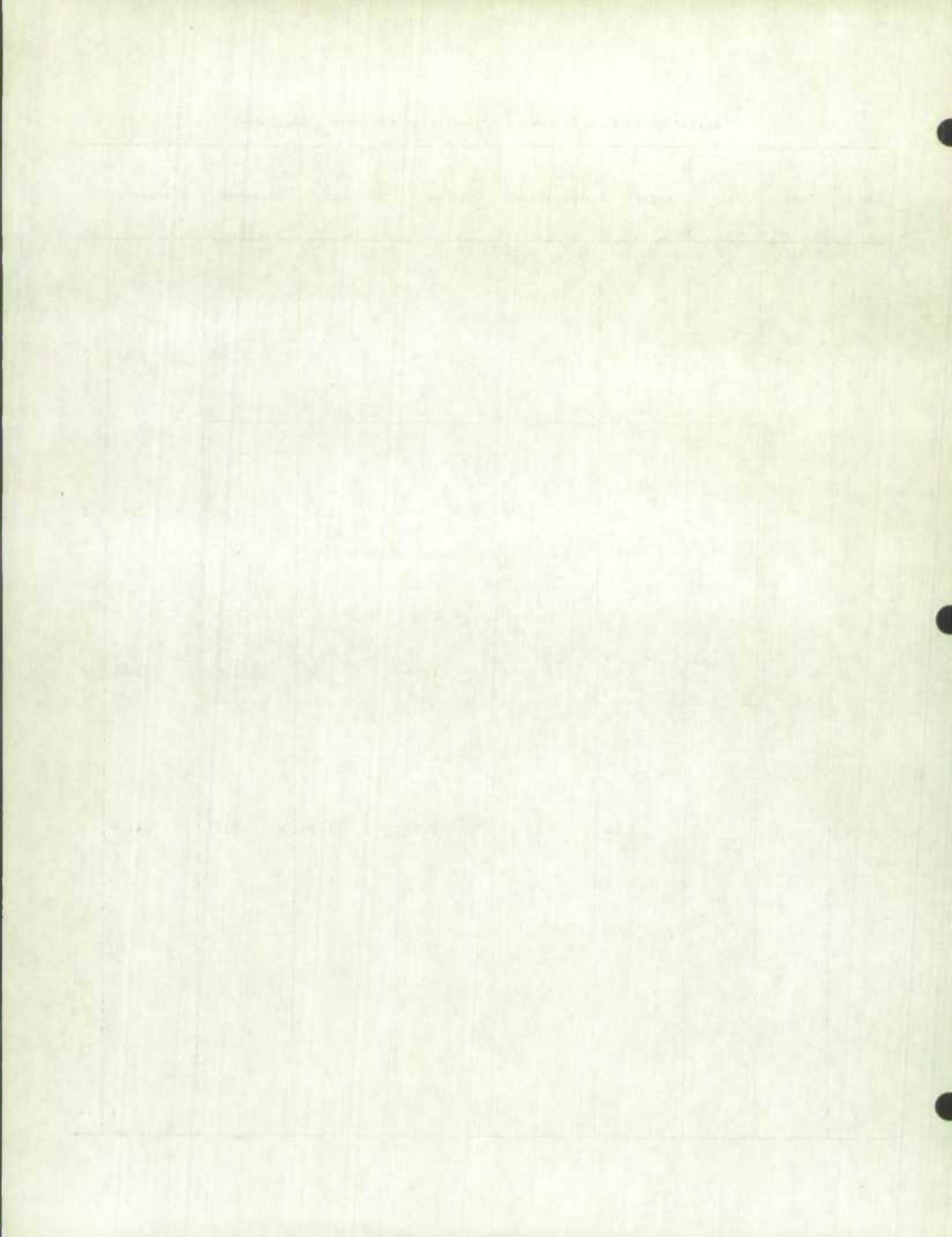

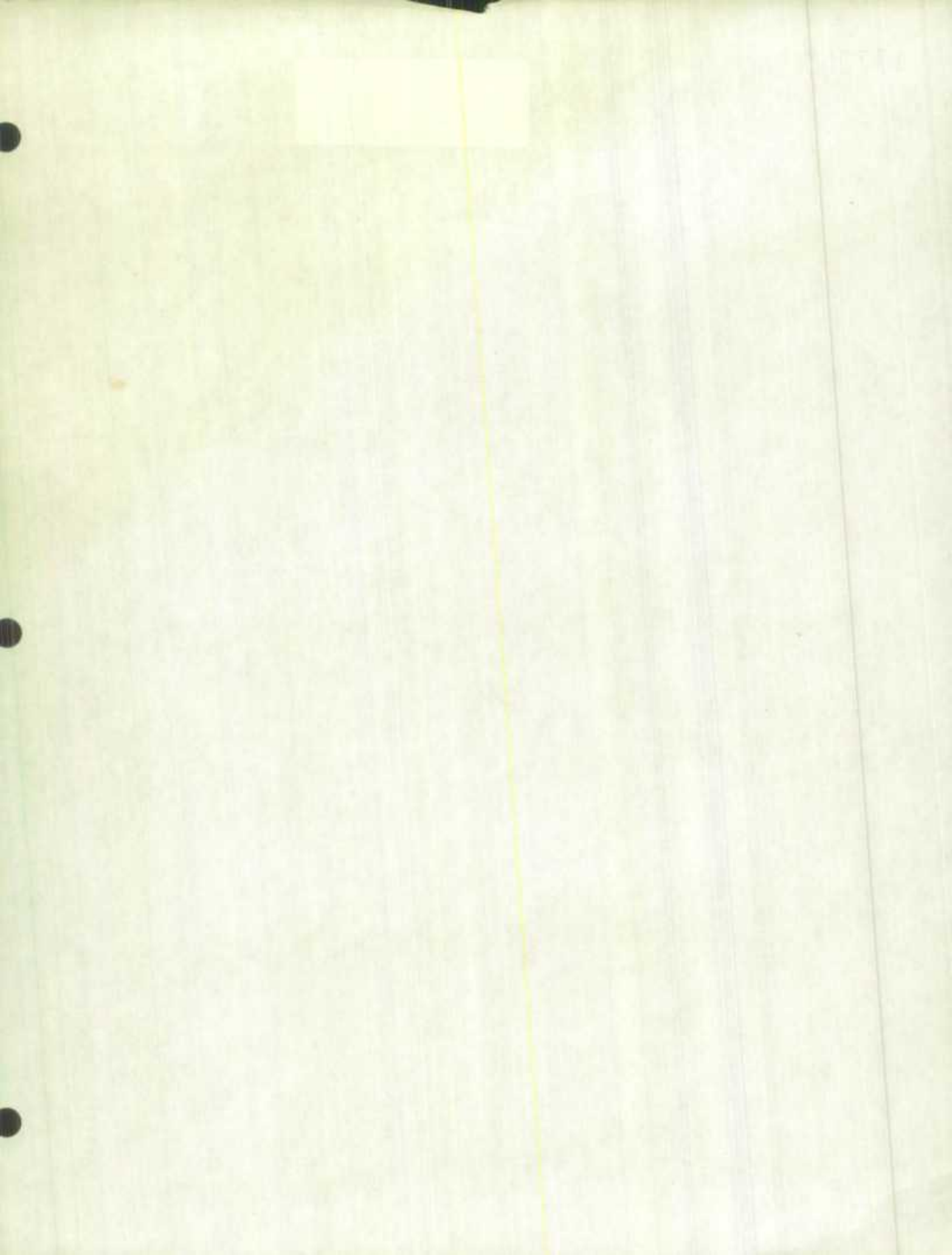
